Advent Themes

We begin this third week of Advent with the anticipation that Christmas is soon approaching. When we began the season of Advent, we heard in Luke's Gospel for the first

week of Advent, Jesus telling his disciples to be watchful, stay alert.

Luke's gospel presents us with four themes in our preparation for the feast of Christmas. Each of these themes enables us to reflect upon this season and points us to the birth of Christ. The themes that the scriptures present to us are preparation, joy, hope, and love.

Each one is a stepping stone for our celebration of Christ being born into the world. They are themes that allow us to focus on what is important in our lives. In my office I have many mementos that I have received from people throughout my years of being a priest. In the early days of my priesthood, I received a framed piece of needlepoint. In every assignment I had, that framed needlepoint was the last thing I packed and the first thing I unpacked when I arrived at a new parish.

It serves as a point of focus for me when events or situations became overwhelming. Life can sometimes be overwhelming, we begin to feel pulled in various directions and we lose our focus. The words on the needlepoint help me to focus on what is important in my life and pulls me back to the events and situation at hand. Those three simple, yet powerful words are family, faith, and friends.

As we draw closer to our journey towards Bethlehem, may we prepare ourselves to receive Him who is our joy, our hope, and our love.

We have now entered the second half of the Advent season - Gaudete Sunday! "The Third Sunday of Advent, (like the Fourth Sunday of Lent) is a day of joy in the midst of our spiritual preparations for

Christmas. It is traditionally called Gaudete Sunday, from the Latin of the Entrance Antiphon for today. The antiphon captures the mood of the entire liturgy as we move into the second part of Advent: there is a sense of joyful expectation, an awareness that the fulfillment of God's great plan for us is near" (Sourcebook for Sundays. Seasons and Weekdays, 2020).

John the Baptist is an interesting character. He is a prophet, not a person who tells of the future, but a person who serves as God's messenger. Prophets in the Old Testament brought warnings to the people to return to God's ways, which they generally struggled to follow. We see the role of the prophets throughout the Old Testament, including John who is known as the last prophet. His message was also a call to repentance, but also to ready the way of the Lord. His role was to prepare the people for the earthly mission of Jesus.

There is a decidedly joyful sense in today's readings. In the reading from Isaiah we hear of the Israelites returning from Exile, singing, "I will greatly rejoice in the Lord...for God has clothed me with the garments of salvation (61:10). In Paul's letter to the Thessalonians, he reminds his readers to "rejoice always" (5:16). John the Baptist provides us a beautiful example of joy and humility, "there is one among you whom you do not recognize, the one who is coming after me, whose sandal strap I am not worthy to untie." (John 1:26-27). As we reflect on God's word, let us rejoice, for we know that God is with us.

It is sometimes challenging to look around us and see reasons for rejoicing. We can look to the readings today for inspiration and a renewal of hope, hope in the Lord, not the things of this world. Advent is a journey towards Bethlehem and today, we are half-way there. "Let yourself be drawn in by the light of God made man" (Pope Francis). So rejoice, but as we rejoice, we also must prepare. We prepare for the coming of the Son of God, into the world, into our hearts, and at the end of time. Let us try to put aside all the busyness and craziness of the world and concentrate on preparing our hearts for the divine presence in us and among us.


