

"...for nothing will be impossible for God." Luke 1:37

As we celebrated the last Sunday of Advent, our preparations for the coming

of Jesus began to wind down. The journey to Bethlehem is complete. We can see the light of God that drew the shepherds, and we feel the pull of that light, leading us to the Christ child. The focus of the Gospel was on Jesus and the seemingly impossible way he entered into the world through Mary.

We heard of Mary's great "Yes" to God. We often talk of Mary's incredible courage and obedience when we heard the Gospel. Mary was, indeed, courageous and obedient. I think of Mary also as a very trusting and patient woman. As a mother myself, I remember the time spent waiting for the arrival of my children. I was impatient near the end of the pregnancies. I could not wait to see my child, to see what he or she looked like, to see what God had accomplished. I could not wait to begin the actual parenting.

I imagine Mary felt many of these same things, yet far more was at stake. How must Mary have felt knowing she was carrying not an ordinary child, but a child, "to be called holy, the Son of God." She had no idea what to expect, no books, no doctors, no internet, and no one to give her the gift of their wisdom and experience on how to raise the Son of God. But Mary had her steadfast love and trust of God. She listened to the angel. She opened herself up to God's plan from the beginning. Patience likely came from that listening and opening. On top of all that, she had the power of the Holy Spirit!

When the Holy Spirit is allowed to enter into our hearts, nothing is impossible. Mary knew that. Her relationship with God made it possible for her to say yes to an unimaginable future, to trust that God would guide her as she waited for Jesus to be born and to show her the way as she and Joseph did the work of raising him.

We live in uncertain times, with war and disunity all around us. It is helpful to remember that God's time is different from our time. As we strive to love one another and seek the common good, can we echo Mary's "yes" by being patient, obedient, and trusting as God works in our lives? Can we take on the challenges and blessings of this life knowing that we are not on our own and that nothing is impossible for God?

The fourth week of Advent this year was just a day...we moved directly into the Octave of Christmas with the Christmas Vigil Masses Sunday evening and Christmas Day Masses on Monday. During all the festivities, try to spend some time pondering the work of the Holy Spirit in the story of Jesus' birth: Mary's openness to the annunciation, the visitation of Mary to Elizabeth, the humble birth, the adoration of the shepherds, the presentation of the infant Jesus in the Temple, and much more. In just two chapters of Luke's Gospel, we experience the early years of Jesus, in what little we are given to know about his young life. Like Mary, ponder these miraculous events deeply in your heart and "Let yourself be drawn by the light of God made man" (Pope Francis).

Peace, Laurie For a child is born to us, a son is given us; upon his shoulder dominion rests. They name him Wonder-Counselor, God-Hero, Father-Forever, Prince of Peace. His dominion is vast and forever peaceful. Isaiah 9:5-6

MERRY CHRISTMAS!

Our time of preparation for Christ's second coming at the end of time and to the anniversary of Our Lord's birth on Christmas Day culminates in our celebrations today. Our waiting and preparing for the coming of Jesus have led us to this great celebration today — we are so glad you are here! As members of the one family of God, we are grateful for your presence and rejoice in celebrating together the great gift of Jesus to our whole family. My prayer is that the season brings peace and joy to you and yours.

As we go forth from Mass today, may we be filled with gratitude for the great gift of Jesus and jubilantly spread the joy of the Gospel throughout our world!

With the New Year right around the corner, now is a good time to make plans to nurture and grow your relationship with God. It is in the Scriptures that we learn about God's actions in the world before He sent his Son and the details of Jesus' ministry on earth. We have two opportunities to delve into the Scriptures and the life of the Holy Trinity here at St. Jane:

Bible Study

The next session of Bible Study begins Tuesday, January 2, 2024, and runs through February 6, 2024. Each Bible Study session lasts six weeks, meeting each of those weeks on Tuesday morning from 10:00am-11:30am. For our next session we will complete the Book of Genesis, verses 37-50: Joseph the Dreamer. "The story of Joseph and his brothers is one of the most popular stories in the book of Genesis—so popular, in fact, that it was made into a Broadway musical! In Genesis 37–50: Joseph the Dreamer, author Kevin Perrotta helps us see why the story of Joseph is so critical to a proper understanding of the book of Genesis and helps us apply this beloved story to our own lives of faith."

The series we use is very understandable and organized to provide both fascinating insight to the Scriptures as well as a lot of opportunity to discuss and share. The guide includes the Scripture passages, insights from Church fathers and saints, questions for discussion and reflection, and prayer suggestions. It does not matter if you have never studied the Bible before or if you experience with Bible study, all are welcome!

Reading and reflecting on Scripture provides a wonderful way to get to know God and enter into deeper relationship with him. I look forward to sharing Scripture with others, growing in understanding God's word while sharing our different viewpoints!

The Chosen Video and Discussion Series

For Lent 2023 we began a journey to encounter Jesus in a different way, gathering to watch and discuss the popular series about the life of Christ, The Chosen. A good number of people enjoyed the series and the enlightening discussions after each episode that allowed for a deeper understanding of the Scriptures as well as a variety of viewpoints. We then continued with Season 2 from September – November this year.


What's The Chosen?

"As the biggest crowdfunded project in TV history, The Chosen is the first-ever multi-season show about the life of Jesus. This series allows viewers to see the life of Jesus through the eyes of those that knew Him. Follow the transformations of His followers through the ministry of Jesus as He journeys to change the world." Our goal in gathering is to watch together and enter into dialog to deepen the experience and grow in relationship with others and Jesus. We will watch and discuss Season 3 of The Chosen beginning two weeks before Lent 2024; eight consecutive Thursday afternoons from 2:00pm-3:30pm, February 1st through March 21st.



GOSPEL: Luke 1:26-38

In the sixth month of Elizabeth's pregnancy, God sent the angel Gabriel to Nazareth, a town in Galilee, to a virgin pledged to be married to a man named Joseph, a descendant of David. The virgin's name was Mary. The angel went to her and said, "The Lord is with you." Mary was greatly troubled at his words and wondered what kind of greeting this might be. But the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary; you have found favor with God. You will conceive and give birth to a son, and you are to call him Jesus. He will be great and will be called Emmanuel." "How will this be?" Mary asked. The angel answered, "The Holy Spirit will come on you, so the holy one to be born will be called the Son of God." "I am the Lord's servant," Mary answered. "May your word to me be fulfilled." Then the angel left her.

REFLECTION

This Christmas, in fact, every day throughout the year, we can look to Mary as a model of the way we should live our lives. ACTIVITIES

BLESSING OF A CHRISTMAS TREE

The use of the Christmas tree is relatively modern. Its origins are found in the medieval mystery plays that depicted the tree of paradise and the Christmas light or candle that symbolized Christ, the light of the world.

According to custom, the Christmas tree is set up just before Christmas and may remain in place until the Solemnity of the Epiphany.

The lights of the tree are illuminated after the prayer of blessing.

When all have gathered, a suitable song may be sung.

The leader makes the sign of the cross, and all reply "Amen."

The leader may greet those present in the following words:

"Let us glorify Christ our light, who brings salvation and peace into our midst, now and forever."

All reply "Amen."

In the following or similar words, the leader prepares those present for the blessing:

"My brothers and sisters, amidst signs and wonders, Christ Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea: his birth brings joy to our hearts and enlightenment to our minds. With this tree, decorated and adorned, may we welcome Christ among us; may its lights guide us to the perfect light."

One of those present or the leader reads a text of sacred Scripture, for example:

"Listen to the words of the Letter of St. Paul to Titus (3:4-7):

But when the kindness and generous love of God our savior appeared, not because of any righteous deeds we had done but because of his mercy, he saved us through the bath of rebirth and renewal by the holy Spirit, whom he richly poured out on us through Jesus Christ our savior, so that we might be justified by his grace and become heirs in hope of eternal life."

Or Ezekiel 17:22-24:

"I will plant a tender shoot on the mountain heights of Israel."

Reader: "The Word of the Lord."

All reply "Thanks be to God."

The intercessions are then said. The leader says:

"Let us ask God to send his blessing upon us and upon this sign of our faith in the Lord."

All reply "Lord, give light to our hearts."


