ALTAR LINEN MINISTRY NEED

We are in need of two or more people who are willing to launder the altar linens. This ministry is perfect for anyone who has the time to launder the purificators and towels twice a month for two separate months during the year. Instructions are provided and the time frame during the week is flexible. Essentially, linens are picked up after 11:30am Mass or on a Monday and returned by Thursday of the week. Launderers are scheduled for a whole month at a time, no more than two months per year. Purificators must be ironed after laundering, which provides a great time to reflect on the Eucharist and pray while you iron the simple squares of fabric.

GOSPEL: Mark 13:33-37

Jesus said to his disciples: "Be watchful! Be alert!

You do not know when the time will come. It is like a man traveling abroad. He leaves home and places his servants in charge, each with his own work, and orders the gatekeeper to be on the watch. Below are highlights for 3 of the 9 agencies we are supporting this year.

<u>Justice Initiative, St. Vincent de Paul</u> 313-524-9903 https://svdpdetroit.org/How-We-Help/Education--Mentorships

Many inmates in jails and prisons have no one to visit them, and when released have virtually no resources. The Justice Initiative ministry of SVDP reaches out with hope to the incarcerated, ministering to their physical, emotional, and spiritual needs. They help those who are released to effectively transition into society.

The Justice Initiative also assists families who have one or both parents incarcerated.

<u>Services include</u>: Inmate visits for spiritual support, friendship, and prayer - Mentoring and education for life skills and employment - Post-release pastoral services and care visits - Assistance with food, clothing, bus passes, tools, housing, and other necessities

Coffee House Ministry for Special Needs Adults 586-805-3006

Coffee House Ministry is a **dinner/dance event** offered six times a year for over 200 special needs adults and caregivers from the tri-county area. It provides guests the opportunity to develop social interaction, form **friendships**, celebrate with their caregivers, and **know they are valued and supported as God's children**.

The events are held at St. Jane Frances, and **organized and funded by donations. 35-40 volunteers** assist with setup, cooking/serving and cleanup. The Knights of Columbus help sponsor and assist at the events.

Each event provides: A safe and welcoming environment - a snack, dinner meal, and dessert - DJ and dance [Halloween includes trick-or-treat, and Christmas includes a gift for each guest]

The Good Eggs Foundation https://www.thegoodeggs.org

The Good Eggs Foundation **advocates and raises funds** to support educational resources, monetary assistance and basic needs for children and families by **connecting with organizations** that benefit children in need. They also respond to **specific needs earmarked by those organizations**.

To encourage children to read at home, the Good Eggs partners with individuals, foundations, local businesses, and corporate donors who help sponsor "Reading Nests" which consist of a bean bag chair, a set of *The Good Eggs* books, and an egg-shaped stress release squishy.
