Anointing of the Sick

On the 11th of February, the Church throughout the world remembers and celebrates the World

Day of the Sick. It is a day set aside each year to remember all those who are ill and suffering some form of illness. It is also a day in which we remember all those people who are caregivers to the sick and the infirmed. As we celebrate the World Day of the Sick let us not forget those who are caregivers and thank God that they responded to this ministry for a family member, a friend or a loved one.

The Church believes and confesses that among the seven sacraments there is one especially intended to strengthen those who are tried by illness, the Anointing of the Sick. --- Catechism of the Catholic Church.

One of the greatest joys of my priesthood is celebrating the Anointing of the Sick with those who are ill or infirmed. I would like to clarify a particular point about hospital calls. I am always more than happy to make a visit to the hospital to anoint someone.

What you may not know is that many hospitals hire a priest to be a member of their Pastoral Care team. The hospitals in our area have a priest on staff. For the staff in the hospitals, the Pastoral Care Department in the hospital becomes their "parish" if I can use that analogy. That being said, if you are in the hospital and are in need of a priest you should call the hospital's Pastoral Care Department first. At Troy Beaumont, Fr. Joy is the Priest chaplain.

If you know you are going to be in the hospital or you are going to have surgery you can always see me prior to your going to the hospital and I would be happy to celebrate the sacrament with you. In regards to the monthly Anointing Mass on the last Tuesday of the month, the Mass and the Anointing will be celebrated in the chapel. The Anointing will be celebrated following the Mass. Aside from Holy Days, the weekday Masses are celebrated in the chapel.

Because the Anointing of the Sick contains within the forgiveness of sins only a priest can validly administer anointing of the sick. All priests to whom the care of souls has been committed have the duty and the right to administer the anointing of the sick to all the faithful committed to their pastoral office; for a reasonable cause any other priest can administer the sacrament with at least the presumed consent of the aforementioned priest. --- Canon 1003,2 , Code of Canon Law.

Bon Mot: The anointing is therefore a source of strength for both the soul and the body, but always in order that bodily healing may bring greater union with God through the increase of grace.--- St. John Paul II. *The Seven Sacrament*, October 1982.

Lent is fast approaching and we have been busy making plans for parish opportunities to aid in your Easter preparations. One opportunity is formation sessions using a video series about the life of Christ, *The Chosen*, an opportunity to encounter Jesus in a different way.

What's *The Chosen*?

"As the biggest crowdfunded project in TV history, *The Chosen* is the first-ever multi-season show about the life of Jesus. REFLECTION

Jesus thrived on imagery and loved showing examples in everyday life to apply to faith. Throughout His ministry, He used parables, images, and metaphors to emphasize His points. Some of these comparisons deal with how Christians should be, or what we should be like. This gospel uses some of those images to make some important statements about Christian life and attitude: salt and light. Christians are called to change things in the world and point the way to Jesus; we can impact the world for Christ in amazing ways when we follow Him.

FAMILY ACTIVITIES

CANDLE MIX-UP: Gather one small candle and three cups. Flip the cups over onto a table top and put the candle under one of them. Quickly shuffle the cups in and out of the three spots. See if family members can guess which cup the candle is under.

SALT TASTE TEST: Put two spoons on the table or counter. Have salt in one and sugar in the other. Have three cups of water available. Put the salt in one glass, the sugar in another and leave the third with just plain water. Have family members taste any two of the three glasses and describe in one word the difference between them. Apply that word to our faith.
