HOLY THURSDAY LITURGY

I have had several questions this year about the events of Holy Week, and particularly the Easter Triduum. It seems a suitable time to share some information about the focus of the liturgies and the major elements. This week I will address Holy Thursday, the feast day of the institution of the priesthood and of the Eucharist.

Celebrating the institution of the priesthood occurs at the **Chrism Mass** on Holy Thursday morning, at the Blessed Sacrament Cathedral. The priests renew their commitment to their vocation and the people are asked to pray for them. Also at this Mass, is the blessing of the three holy oils used in the Church. The bishop celebrates the rite of the blessing of oils and consecrating the chrism, preparing the sacred oils for use in the diocese. The oils are received in our parish on Holy Thursday evening and placed in the ambry. The oils will then be used throughout the year for Baptism, Confirmation, and Anointing of the Sick. The oils are used as follows:

- The oil of the sick for the anointing of all those who suffer in mind and body. By this holy anointing, may the sick gain strength, be released from fear, and receive the consolation of faith.
- The oil of catechumens for the anointing of all infants, children, and adults who ask to be baptized. By this anointing, may they be strengthened in their journey to the waters of new birth.
- The Holy Chrism, the mixture of oil and fragrant perfume for the anointing of the baptized in the Sacrament of Confirmation, for the anointing of the presbyters' hands and the bishop's head and also the altar and walls of the church. By this anointing, we confer the presence and essence of the Holy Spirit.

The Three Holy Oils are an essential element in the sacramental life of our church.

At the **Mass of the Lord's Supper** in the evening, the Triduum (three days) begins, celebrating the institution of the Holy Eucharist. At this Holy Thursday Mass, March 28th at 7:00pm, Fr. Tony will wash the feet of twelve parish members. The foot washing on Holy Thursday may seem somewhat strange and old-fashioned. The church has kept it in the liturgy for good reason. As Christ washed the feet of his disciples at the Last Supper, emphasizing for them the connection between Eucharist and service to others, this ritual remains in our liturgy for the same reason. It is to emphasize that the Eucharist is not separate from service, but that they are inextricably bound together. The essential nature of Holy Communion is unity, not only with God, but also with one another. **Please prayerfully consider participating - having your feet washed in this way is a powerful and humbling encounter with the heart of discipleship! If you would like to participate in this beautiful act of service, please contact me via phone or email.**

The Mass of the Lord's Supper ends with the priest taking the Blessed Sacrament from the main tabernacle to a separate altar of repose, in our chapel area, where adoration continues until 10:00pm, closing with Evening Prayer.

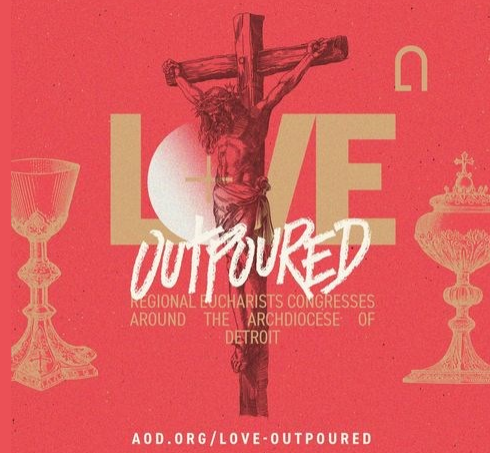

GOSPEL: John 9:1-41 - Jesus heals a man born blind

REFLECTION

Jesus performed many miracles in his life. We need to know and understand just how powerful God is and that He is capable of anything, even if it seems confusing or strange. When we are sad, upset, angry or feel lost, God is always there to comfort us. He can get us through any situation, even if it seems hopeless. We need to believe this and always be grateful for Jesus in our lives, knowing that he works in unexpected ways.

ACTIVITIES

- 1) Have 2 people in your family sit at a table with a blank paper in front of them. Let both of them pick a pen, pencil, colored pencil or marker to put in their hand. Then blindfold them and have them both draw the same thing on the paper (house, heaven, beach, your yard, etc). After they are done, remove the blindfolds and share what they drew. Repeat for other family members.
- 2) Put items in a bag or box (keys, remote control, cell phone, spoon, ping pong ball, toys, etc). Have a family member, without looking, reach in and touch the items, trying to identify them, being very specific. They can't just say "ball", they have to identify it as "ping pong ball".
