Last week, I wrote about the beginning of the Triduum (three days), with the **Mass** of the Lord's Supper. The Mass of the Lord's Supper concludes with Adoration at the Altar of Repose in our Chapel. The

Triduum continues on Good Friday with the liturgy of the Passion of the Lord. At the Good Friday liturgy, the Mass continues, with three key parts:

- 1. Liturgy of the Word, where we hear the story of the passion from John's Gospel and pray for the Church and the world. The liturgy begins with the presider reverencing the altar and then moves immediately into the Old (Isaiah 52:13-53:12) and New Testament readings (Hebrews 4:14-16; 5:7-9) and the Gospel (the Passion narrative according to John). The Gospel is read in the same way as it was on Palm Sunday, always from the Gospel of John rather than from one of the synoptic gospels (this year our Palm Sunday reading is from the Gospel of Mark). What follows is a brief homily and then the Solemn Intercessions, a series of petitions that are universally prayed throughout the world, for the needs of many, including the Holy Church, the Pope, catechumens, the Jewish people, and several other needs.
- 2. Adoration of the Holy Cross follows the Liturgy of the Word. Here we approach the cross with a sign of reverence for this symbol of our salvation, this sign of God's love for us. We reverence the cross because we adore Christ, and we thank him for his perfect sacrifice on the cross. At St. Jane Frances, we conclude the Good Friday liturgy with the assembly participating in reverencing the cross.
- The third part of the Good Friday liturgy is Holy Communion, different as the Liturgy of the Eucharist is not celebrated on this day. Holy Communion is distributed from the reserved Blessed Sacrament consecrated on Holy Thursday.


The liturgy ends without fanfare. All are invited to reverence the cross and spend some time in prayer, reflecting on the great sacrifice of Christ for the salvation of all.

Good Friday is a day of fast and abstinence. We are encouraged to pray, reflecting on Jesus' death and pondering what it means for us.

On both Palm Sunday and Good Friday, we participate in the proclamation of the passion narratives. The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops' Committees on Divine Worship and Ecumenical and Interreligious Affairs wishes to ensure that the proclamation of the Lord's Passion is not misused to promote anti-Jewish sentiment. The following is a statement from the above-named committees:

• The passion narratives are proclaimed in full so that all see vividly the love of Christ for each person. In light of this, the crimes during the Passion of Christ cannot be attributed, in either preaching or catechesis, indiscriminately to all Jews of that time, nor to Jews today. The Jewish people should not be referred to as though rejected or cursed, as if this view followed from Scripture. The Church ever keeps in mind that Jesus, his mother Mary, and the apostles all were Jewish. As the Church has always held, Christ freely suffered his passion and death because of the sins of all, that all might be saved.
