FrTony@sjfparish.org It is difficult for me to believe that Holy Week is upon us. Holy week has a great significance in my life. When I was a seminarian at St. John's Provincial Seminary in Plymouth,

Michigan we had the opportunity to study in Israel for 11 weeks. We lived in Ein Karem, the birth place of St. John the Baptist, and we studied in Jerusalem. We staved with the Sisters of Sion who have their motherhouse and convent in Ein Karem.

We made many day trips to various areas in and around Jerusalem. From travelling to the Sea of Galilee to climbing Mt. Sinai to see the little town of Bethlehem, it is a trip I will always remember. As a side note, I made a second trip to Israel ten years after I was ordained and celebrated Masses at the places important in the life and ministry of Jesus. I look forward to returning to Israel next year to see friends that I still keep in contact with. And to visit the places that hold a special place in my heart. For those who have been to Israel you will agree that the Scriptures take on a deeper meaning when you see and visit the places we hear about in the Scriptures.

During that time we travelled all over Israel and walked in the footsteps of Jesus. The most memorable week of that trip was Holy Week. We celebrated Mass in the upper room on Holy Thursday, walked the Via Dolores on Good Friday, slept in the garden of Gethsemane, and visited the tomb of Jesus on Easter Sunday morning. It was a trip that I will never forget.

For those who have been to Israel, once you have been to the places Jesus walked and taught the Holy Scriptures take on a deeper and richer meaning for you. You will never read or hear the Word of God proclaim the same again. The Word of God becomes more meaningful because you visited the very spot where it happened.

My last pilgrimage to Israel, afforded me the opportunity to say mass for the group that was travelling with me in the Holy Sepulcher where Jesus was buried and rose that Easter morning.

I invite you to take part in the Holy Week liturgies from Passion Sunday to Easter morning. The liturgies are rich in tradition and each liturgy has its own distinction within Holy week and they point us to the great feast of Easter. Again, I invite you to take part in all or some of the liturgies of Holy Week as we prepare for Easter.

Have a joyous and wonderful Holy Week.

Laurie Hall Pastoral Associate LHall@sjfparish.org Ext. 104 Today concludes the short review of the Triduum liturgies begun two weeks ago. Following the start of the Triduum (three days) on Holy Thursday with the **Mass of the Lord's Supper** and the liturgy of the

Passion of the Lord on Good Friday (covered last week), we celebrate the greatest solemnity in the life of the Catholic Church, the Easter Vigil in the Holy Night.

Having attended the Good Friday liturgy, we gather again for the Easter Vigil so that we may experience the complete message of our faith, the assurance that death and sin have been conquered! The Roman Missal provides a beautiful explanation:

Of this night's Vigil, which is the greatest and most noble of all solemnities, there is to be only one celebration...arranged...in such a way that...Holy Church meditates on the wonders the Lord God has done for his people from the beginning, trusting in his word and promise until, as day approaches...the Church is called to the table the Lord has prepared for his people, the memorial of his Death and Resurrection until he comes again.

### There are four parts to the great Easter Vigil:

- 1. This Mass begins in darkness that will soon be illuminated by the candles held by those gathered, spreading the light from the Paschal candle much like our faith is passed from person to person. The Solemn Beginning (or Lucernarium) includes brief instructions about the night vigil and a blessing of the Paschal candle, done at the doors of the worship space. A Procession with the newly lit Paschal candle follows, with three stops within the worship space where the candle is displayed and the people's candles are lit. Gradually, the light of Christ dispels the darkness. Once the candle is placed in its holder near the sanctuary, the Easter Proclamation (Exsultet) is sung. The Exsultet is a proclamation of great rejoicing over the many gifts of God and his victory over sin and death and concludes with asking God to accept the candle as a beacon of light, overcoming the darkness.
- 2. The second part of the Easter Vigil is the Liturgy of the Word. Lectors proclaim multiple readings that lead us to reflect on God's faithful love throughout salvation history. Up to seven readings from the Old Testament are proclaimed, with psalms and prayers interspersed. We also hear St. Paul's epistle from Romans that proclaims Christ's death and our participation through Baptism so that "we too might live in newness of life" (6:4). We sing the "Alleluia" for the first time since Lent began and we hear the Gospel proclamation.
- 3. The third part of the Easter Vigil is the Baptismal Liturgy. The new waters are blessed and, if there are catechumens, they are baptized. All of us participate in the Renewal of Baptismal Promises.
- 4. The fourth and final part of the Mass is the Liturgy of the Eucharist. This is done in the usual way, concluding with distribution of Holy Communion. As with every Mass, we are then sent forth to be Christ's body in the world.

To truly enter into Christ's passion, death, and resurrection, attend each liturgy of Holy Week. It is through the commemoration of the historical events in a sacramental way that brings these sacred mysteries present to us today. We begin the Easter season with a profound awareness of God's saving grace and a renewed spirit to share the good news of Jesus Christ with all we meet.
