I hope and pray that everyone is staying well. I remember all of you in my prayers and daily mass. May we be thankful that we are able to gather in Church to celebrate the Easter joy and come together as a faith community. That is what church is all about, coming together to celebrate as a parish family and lifting each other up in prayer.

As we are in the midst and celebrate this Easter season I would like to share with you a prayer that is attributed to Saint Oscar Arnulfo Romero, but pronounced for the first time by Cardinal John Dearden. This prayer reminds us that God has a plan for each one of us and we are invited to participate in that plan. God is greater than we can ever imagine. As we bring to closure the Easter season let us be open to God's plan for us. It is not important that we understand His plan. What is important is that we surrender ourselves to His plan.

Every now and then it helps us to take a step back and to see from a distance. The Kingdom is not only beyond our efforts, it is also not beyond our vision. In our lives, we manage only to achieve a small part of the marvelous plan that is God's work. Nothing that we do is complete, which is to say that the Kingdom is greater than ourselves. No statement says everything that can be said. No prayer completely expresses the faith. No creed brings perfection. No pastoral visit solves every problem. No programs fully accomplish the mission of the Church. No goal or purpose ever reaches completion. This is what it is about. We plant seeds that one day will grow. We water seeds already planted, knowing that others will watch over them. We lay the foundation of something that will develop. We add the yeast which will multiply the possibilities. We cannot do everything yet it is liberating to begin. This gives us strength to do something and do it well. It may remain incomplete, but it is a beginning, a step along the way. It is an opportunity for the grace of God to enter and to do the rest. It may be that we will never see its completion, but that is the difference between the master and the laborer. We are laborers, not master builders, servants, not the Messiah. We are prophets of a future that does not belong to us. Today's article completes the series embarked upon at the beginning of Lent as we continue on our journey to holiness, a life led as a reflection of the love and teachings of Jesus Christ, made possible by the grace

given us in the Sacraments. The second sacrament of service, Holy Orders, is the sacrament through which the mission entrusted by Christ to his apostles continues to be exercised in the church until the end of time; thus, it is the sacrament of apostolic ministry. This includes the roles of bishop, priest, and deacon. The Sacrament of Holy Orders is conferred not for the benefit or advantage of the recipient, but for the service of God and the church—the mission which Christ entrusted unto his people. Those who are called to serve God through the sacrament of holy orders are also called to minister to the people of God and to help them grow in their faith. At the same time as Jesus instituted the Eucharist, he also instituted the priesthood. At the Last Supper, Jesus commanded the apostles to "Do this in remembrance of me" (Luke 22:19). With these words, Jesus charged his apostles with the privilege and the duty to carry on his priesthood by continually offering the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. The matter of the sacrament of holy orders is the imposition of hands by the ordinary minister, the bishop. The form is the adherence to the prayer of consecration for each order (bishop, priest, or deacon). The effects of this sacrament are the sacramental character (like the seal received in baptism and confirmation) that strengthens the recipient to overcome temptation and live one's vocation for life, and the charism needed in the church and the ministry. The grace of this sacrament enables the bishop, priest, or deacon to build up the Church through the administration of the sacraments, proclamation of the word of God, and pastoral care. This Lenten season, we've explored the seven sacraments, what they mean, and the role they play in the Catholic church. I hope you've enjoyed this journey of learning more about the sacraments!

Preparing for Mass is just as important as attending. At St. Jane Frances de Chantal, prayerful silence preceding Mass is usually the norm, but on occasion, the Instruments In Praise

(IIP) group has done a prelude piece on the first and third Saturdays when they are scheduled. This all changed during COVID, but now, during the Easter season it will resume. The choir has also been practicing again and will provide prayerful music to enhance your preparation with a choir prelude on Sundays at the 9:00am Mass, through Pentecost.

Last Sunday we sang a prayerful spiritual, Blessed Assurance, as a reminder that Jesus is ours.

"Blessed assurance, Jesus is mine! Oh what a foretaste of glory divine; Heir of salvation, purchase of God, born of His spirit, washed in his blood. This is my story, this is my song, praising my Savior, all the day long!"

In the next few weeks, other songs we'll sing are: 'How Beautiful', 'Closer', 'Christ in Me Arise', 'Lamb of God' and 'Going Home'. These selections were chosen for their melodies, but especially for their lyrics. 'How Beautiful', composed by Twila Paris, captures the essence of our love for the Body of Christ, in that 16 young people made their Holy First Communion at the 4:00pm Saturday Mass.

'How beautiful the hands that served the wine and the bread, and the ones of the earth....how beautiful the feet that walked the long dusty road and the hill to the cross."

In the middle of the song, this particular version pays homage to Jesus' death on the cross.

"See, from His head, His hands, His feet, sorrow and love flow mingled down. Did e're such love and sorrow meet, or thorns compose so rich a crown?'

We'll plan on singing the prelude at about 8:50am so that the congregation will still have a few minutes directly before Mass to pray in meditative silence.




