





REFLECTION- JOHN 3:16-18

This may be the most popular verse in the whole bible. It is seen at sporting events and listed on signs in front of stores and for sure in every "end of the world" movie. Why is it so popular? The answer is simple: it states the simple fact that whoever believes in Jesus will have eternal life. This is not a question; it is a fact and St. John makes it perfectly clear. It is the anthem for anyone who considers themselves to be a Christian and kind of our calling card. When I state this gospel verse out loud, it always makes me proud and I hope it does you, too.

FAMILY ACTIVITIES

GOSPEL ON THE MOVE: Write "John 3:16" on a sign like they do at sporting events or in front of stores. Move the sign around the house as a reminder of how powerful the message is. "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life."




