## Holy Birthday to Us

This weekend the church celebrates the feast of Pentecost, the birth of the church. We observe the fulfillment of the Lord's promise to His disciples, *"I will send you the paraclete. The Holy Spirit will instruct you on what you should do."* We

read in the Catechism of the Catholic Church, "On the day of Pentecost when the seven weeks of Easter have come to an end, Christ's Passover is fulfilled in the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, manifested, given and communicated as a divine person: of His fullness, Christ, the Lord, pours out the Spirit in abundance."

There are many titles that are used to refer to the Spirit, the wind, the fire, the comforter- but there is one title that sums up what we are called to be about as people who have been gifted by the Spirit.

## Divine Architect

The Holy Spirit is the architect and we are the co-workers in the building process. In this particular essay, there is one section that I believe is the core of what we must do as people who are empowered by the spirit. It is entitled "Digging the Foundation," to fulfill God's plan for us, we must dig deep into the foundation of who we are to do that we must plow into the very depth of our being.

God created us in His image and likeness, bestowing upon us gifts and talents that are unique to us and us alone. The challenge for us is to become aware of those talents and gifts, and to use them to enhance and to build up the body of Christ, the church.

As co-workers in the building process, we are called to work as one team, with one common goal --- namely to proclaim the Gospel message knowing at all times and at the core of our being that it is God's work that we are doing and not our own.

## Some questions to reflect upon:

- What signs of growth can you detect in our church?
- How do we encourage individuals to share their gifts and talents with the parish community?
- What particular gifts of the Spirit provide the foundation of St. Jane Frances de Chantal parish?

We celebrate 44 years as a parish community in the city of Sterling Heights. May the Spirit that empowered our founders and forbearers, continue to empower us to build up the Body of Christ. As we celebrate the Feast of Pentecost may we reflect upon the prayer of the Holy Spirit, **Come Holy Spirit fill the hearts and minds of your faithful servants. Spirit of the living God fall afresh on us."**

Today we celebrate the great solemnity of Pentecost, remembering the gift of the Holy Spirit, the Advocate. Recorded in the Gospel of Luke, Jesus tells his disciples, "The Advocate, the Holy Spirit whom the Father

will send in my name, will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you." The Holy Spirit dwells within us, strengthening us and guiding us to live out our baptismal call. The gifts of the Holy Spirit help us to fulfill our mission to spread the Good News to all the corners of the earth. This week, spend some time reflecting on these gifts and pray the prayer to the Holy Spirit. Then, go out and share the Good News of Jesus Christ!

**GIFTS OF THE HOLY SPIRIT WISDOM:** With the gift of Wisdom, we see God at work in our lives and in the world. We are directed in matters of judgment about the truth and being able to see the whole image of God. Helps us to understand the purpose of God's plan for us and for the world and to see the world through God's eyes.

**UNDERSTANDING:** With the gift of understanding, we comprehend how we need to live as a follower of Jesus Christ. A person with understanding is not confused by all the conflicting messages in our culture about the right way to live. This gift helps us to learn about ourselves and how to grow in knowing God. Understanding clears away obstacles to true faith.

**KNOWLEDGE:** With the gift of knowledge, we understand the meaning of God's Revelation, especially as expressed in the life and words of Jesus Christ. A person with knowledge is always learning more about the scriptures and tradition. This gift enables us to judge what must be believed and what must not be believed.

**FORTITUDE:** With the gift of courage, we overcome our fear and are willing to take risks as a follower of Jesus Christ. A person with courage is willing to stand up for what is right in the sight of God, even if it means accepting rejection, verbal abuse, or even physical harm and death. The gift of courage allows people the firmness of mind that is required to do good and stand up to evil and, especially, to stand up for Jesus and his teaching.

**COUNSEL:** With the gift of right judgment, we know the difference between right and wrong and we choose to do what is right—we make better moral decisions. The Holy Spirit points us to the most important considerations as we make decisions in life, always choosing good as a means to an end.

**PIETY:** With the gift of reverence we have a deep sense of respect for God and the church. A person with reverence recognizes our total reliance on God and comes before God with humility, trust, and love. In piety we pay worship and duty to God as our Father and have immense trust in God's fatherly love.

**FEAR OF THE LORD:** With the gift of wonder and awe we are aware of the glory and majesty of God and the grateful wonder of His love for us. This fear of the Lord is like a child's fear of offending his father, rather than a fear of punishment. The worst thing that could happen to us is separation from the God that we love.

### PRAYER TO THE HOLY SPIRIT:

Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of Your faithful

And kindle in them the fire of Your love.

Send forth Your Spirit and they shall be created

And You shall renew the face of the earth.

O God, Who instructed the hearts of the faithful

by the light of the Holy Spirit,

Grant us in the same Spirit to be truly wise

and ever rejoice in His consolation.

Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Remember the song 'June is Bustin' Out all Over' from the musical 'Carousel'? Well, it is! The glorious summer months are upon us.....time for relaxing and enjoying the warm breezes, blue skies, gorgeous

vegetation, and even the thunderstorms that our gracious God provides for us. There are so many activities going on in the summer...when I hear of items of interest, I'll pass them along to you. In fact, given that our own Help Ukraine drive is going on the next two weekends, here is an additional event you can attend to assist even more:

On Friday, June 10, two Detroit Catholic music legends will collaborate in a special benefit concert for relief efforts in Ukraine. The concert is entitled "Give Me Jesus"—a Celebration of African American Spirituals—performed by Frances Brockington, soprano, and Norah Duncan IV, piano. This will take place at Michigan's Romanesque architectural treasure, Saint Matthew Catholic Church, in downtown Flint—706 Beach Street. The concert will begin at 7:00pm. Admission to the concert is free. Donations to aid refugees in Ukraine will be accepted and all proceeds will go to Catholic Relief Services.

For Gospel music fans, this will be a program of African American spirituals arranged in new settings by Norah Duncan IV. Born out of the sufferings of slavery, spirituals, much like the Psalms, express every human emotion there is, including hope, despondency, faith, and joy.

Spirituals reflected conditions that are relevant today with regard to situations in which we all find ourselves at various times in our lives. Dr. Duncan composed these musical settings during the pandemic along with all the social unrest in 2020.

Our Choir Prelude for this Pentecost Sunday is a very moving one, 'Go': The lyrics illustrate what the Holy Spirit empowers us to do: "Go ye therefore and teach all nations, Go, go, go.....baptizing them in the name of the Father and Son and Holy Ghost.....Go! If you love Me, really love Me, feed My sheep....and lo I'll be with you forever and ever until the end of the world.....Go!" As you go about your daily activities, please keep these words in mind with anyone you meet. It is easy to put your faith in action.....through interaction.

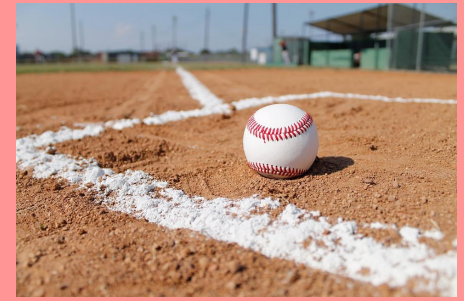

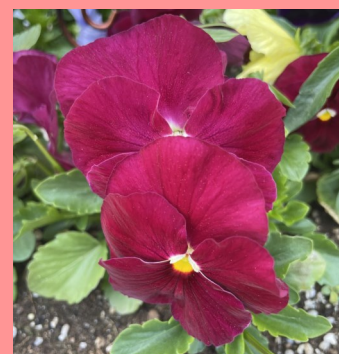
