Summer Is Fleeting

As I sit at the computer writing this article, I am amazed that we are at the midpoint of July. Life does seem to fly by and that is why it is important to enjoy each day as it comes because, as we all know and have experienced from time to time, life can change in a minute.

I hope all of you had a chance to get away for some rest and relaxation. Last week I received a copy of Matthew Kelly's latest book titled **I Heard God Laugh, A Practical Guide to Life's Essential Daily Habit.**

The central focus of the book is the importance of prayer in our life and our daily activities. That our life is centered on prayer and our relationship with God is strengthened through prayer. In the later part of the book, Matthew Kelly presents what he calls the prayer process. This process invites people to a deeper understanding of how their prayer life impacts their relationship with God and those people we come in contact with in our daily life. I hope you find this prayer process helpful and enlightening

The Prayer Process

- 1. Gratitude:** Begin by thanking God in a personal dialogue for whatever you are most grateful for.
- 2. Awareness:** Revisit the times in the past twenty-four hours when you were or were not the "best version of yourself". Talk to God about these situations and what you learned from them.
- 3. Significant moments:** Identify something you experienced today and explore what God might be trying to say to you through that event (or person).
- 4. Peace:** Ask God to forgive you for any wrong you have committed.
- 5. Freedom:** Speak with God about how he is inviting you to change your life, so that you can experience the "best version of yourself".
- 6. Others:** Lift up to God anyone you feel called to pray for today, asking God to bless and guide them.
- 7. Finish:** by praying the Our Father.

As you pray through the process, may you reflect upon your relationship with the Lord. That relationship like any relationship we have with family or friends, is ever changing. Each day is a new opportunity to see God working in our life and in the lives of those we meet along the way. We are called to live in the present and appreciate that God is in that present moment.

As I have written about before, RCIA can be joined at any time, so now is the time to begin praying in earnest for the Holy Spirit to send us seekers. I am asking for the prayers of the entire community to ask God to send us seekers – people looking to form a relationship with Jesus through the Sacraments of the Catholic Church. We can begin the process at any time to prepare people for reception of the Sacraments at Easter Vigil in 2023. Once we have seekers, we will need sponsors and those who are willing to share their faith with a small group. I ask you to please include prayers for a Spirit-filled group of people to come forward to form the RCIA team, but, most importantly, for our evangelization efforts to be increased so that we bring in those seeking initiation.

Struggling with how to pray for seekers? If you need a little inspiration, here are some thoughts:

Pray that God will send his Holy Spirit to those who recognize they are missing something, but don't recognize yet what it is they are missing. "I will give you a new heart, and a new spirit I will put within you. I will remove the heart of stone from your flesh and give you a heart of flesh. I will put my spirit within you so that you walk in my statutes, observe my ordinances, and keep them. You will live in the land I gave to your ancestors; you will be my people, and I will be your God." (Ezekiel 36:26 - 28).

Pray for more people to come to Christ. There is only one way to salvation, through Christ and Christ alone. "Jesus said to him, 'I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me'" (John 14:6). Remember, too, that Christ is the one who calls us. (see Matthew 11:28-30). Pray that God would open people's hearts to believe the gospel. God is always calling us, always seeking to bring us to Himself. We must respond. So pray that God would open the hearts of these unbelievers so they can in turn believe, just as Lydia did. "The Lord opened her heart to pay attention to what Paul was saying" (Acts 16:14).

Pray to the Saints. Here is a prayer from the Catholic Household Blessings and Prayers:

O God, you made your name known to us through the Apostles.

By the intercession of St. Jude,

Let your Church continue to grow

With an increased number of believers.

Grant this through Christ our Lord. AMEN

Finally, pray like the Saints. The following is the prayer of St. Dominic, a beautiful prayer to remind us of our responsibility to live in the Lord, bringing people to God by our example and the Word.

Prayer of St. Dominic

May God the Father who made us bless us.

May God the Son send his healing among us.

May God the Holy Spirit move within us and give us eyes to see with, ears to hear with, and hands that your work might be done.

May we walk and preach the word of God to all.

May the angel of peace watch over us and lead us at last by God's grace to the Kingdom.

It is hard to believe July is already here... the month of coney dog specials, ice cream, fireworks, and hopefully some carefree summer days. We all need that in our lives. God has provided the seasons of

the year for us and we need to use them to recharge in whatever way is beneficial.

For me, summer brings golf events, many charity events which I help run, and some in which I play. I don't have a packed schedule of competitive tournaments as before – there's just no time for them – but try to accept invitations that come my way. My game has suffered due to lack of practice, but, oh well.

A couple of weeks ago I was a guest at the Indianwood Ladies Invitational golf event. I used to be a member at Indianwood Golf and Country Club in Lake Orion back in the '80s when it was just getting back on its feet after many years of disrepair. An older links-style course, it is modeled after those in Scotland or Ireland. The 'New Course' was built in 1986 but in a different style that is very difficult and especially tough for the ladies. We played on both courses.

It's wonderful to connect with old friends at these events, but also disconcerting to see how poorly some folks can behave towards one another.....all in the name of competition. Here, we were privileged to be able to play at a beautiful course, but some people simply had to make the day miserable. On Day 1, my partner and I were blessed to be paired with two delightful playing partners. On Day 2, we were unlucky enough to play with polar opposites. The member was over 80 years old and as crabby as they come. She knew me in my member days from 40 years ago but I was not her target....my less-experienced (and very sweet) partner was. She was intimidating, would correct her on rules, count and announce her strokes and yell at her for some supposed infraction. That day we played a strange, complicated and unfamiliar format and if we paused a moment to make sure we were hitting the right shot, she upbraided us for being too slow. I am not a confrontational person and it was everything I could do to be tactful, understanding this for the gamesmanship it was, absorb the barbs and tell my partner to just walk away.

So why did I let it go and not attack her back? Because I am a Christian Catholic and that is not what Jesus teaches. Because she behaved badly toward us didn't mean I had to do the same. Because I knew she was deliberately trying to intimidate and throw us off.....and, because once I opened my mouth, there would be no turning back. All of this started on the second hole and there were 16 holes of uncomfortable golf left. Who needs that?

Looking deeper, I believe she is a very unhappy individual who has a lot going on behind that tough façade. And so, I prayed for her. It is easy to like or love people who are nice, friendly, and kind. Not so much the ones who aren't...but they need it more. Below is a quote I came across from Native American Chief, Dan George. It speaks to our inner peace as human beings and respect for nature.

"It is hard for me to understand a culture that not only hates and fights his brothers but even attacks Nature and abuses her. Man must love all creation or he will love none of it. Love is something you and I must have. We must have it because our spirit feeds upon it. Without love, our self-esteem weakens. Without it, our courage fails. Without love, we can no longer look out confidently at the world. Instead, we turn inwardly and begin to feed upon our own personalities, and little by little we destroy ourselves."

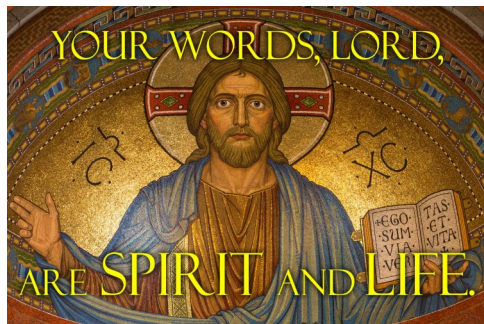

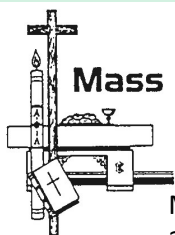

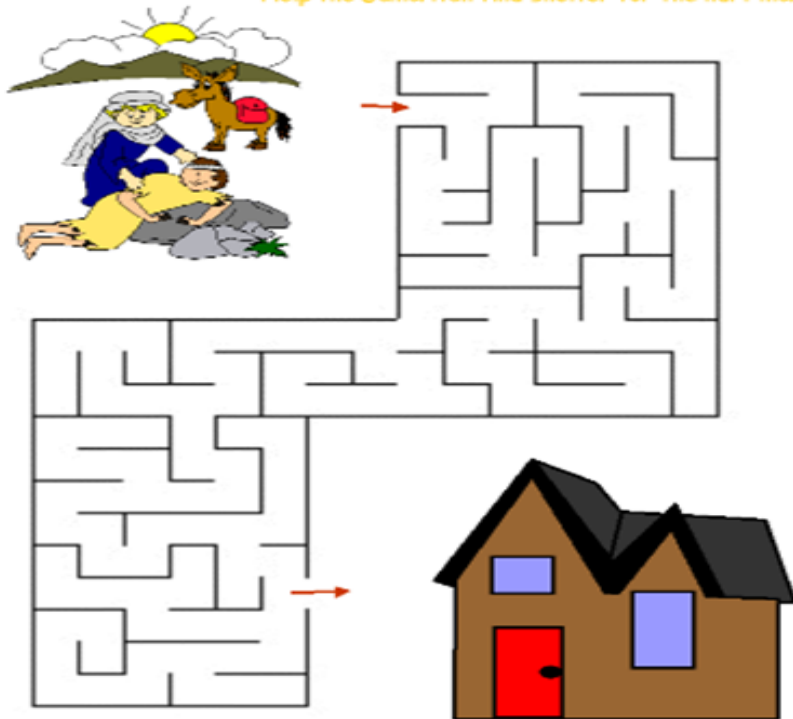
