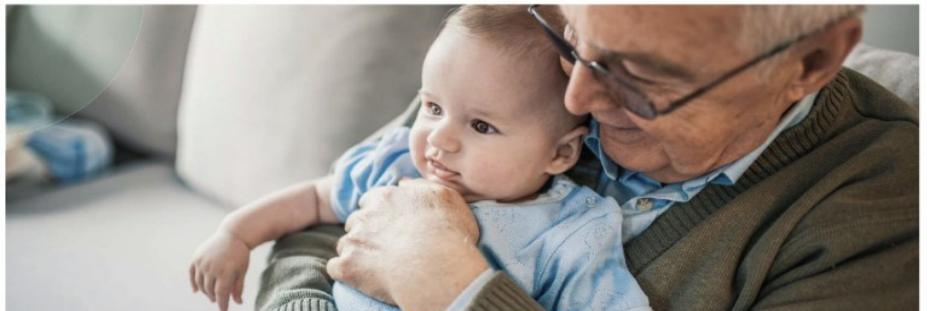
Today we celebrate World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly!

This is a Church-wide celebration that will be held each year on the fourth Sunday of

July, close to the feasts of Saints Joachim and Anne, the grandparents of Jesus. Pope Francis explained that he instituted the World Day of Grandparents and the Elderly because “grandparents are often forgotten, and we forget this wealth of preserving roots and passing on” what the elderly have received. He emphasized the importance of grandparents and grandchildren getting to know one another, because “as the prophet Joel says, grandparents seeing their grandchildren dream,” while “young people, drawing strength from their grandparents, will go forward and prophesy.”

In a press release following the announcement in January of 2021, Cardinal Kevin Farrell, Prefect of the Dicastery for Laity, Family and Life, wrote that “The pastoral care of the elderly is a priority that can no longer be postponed by any Christian community. In the encyclical Fratelli tutti, the Holy Father reminds us that no one is saved alone. With this in mind, we must treasure the spiritual and human wealth that has been handed down from generation to generation.”

Below is a home prayer service, provided by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, that you can use to honor and bless the grandparents and elderly in your life.



This blessing may be used at special family visits (such as holidays), at the beginning or end of a visit, or at another appropriate time. If possible, the oldest grandchild might serve as the leader.

When the grandparents, parents, and children have gathered, all make the sign of the cross.

Leader: Blessed be God, who is faithful through all generations.
 R/. Blessed be God forever.

The leader introduces the blessing in these or similar words:

Grandparents are cherished members of our family. They bring gifts of wisdom, experience, and love and share with us their life of faith. We thank God for their example and ask that he bless them with happiness and good health.

Then the Scripture is read:

Listen to the words of Psalm 128:
 Happy are you who fear the Lord,
 who walk in his ways!
 For you shall eat the fruit of your handiwork;
 happy shall you be, and favored.
 Your wife shall be like a fruitful vine
 in the recesses of your home;
 Your children like olive plants

around your table.
 Behold, thus is the man blessed
 who fears the Lord.
 The Lord bless you from Zion:
 may you see the prosperity of Jerusalem
 all the days of your life.
 May you see your children's children.
 Peace be upon Israel!
(The family Bible may be used for an alternate reading, such as Ezekiel 37:24b-27.)

Reader: The Word of the Lord.
 R/. Thanks be to God.

After a time of silence, all join in prayers of intercession and in the Lord's Prayer. Then the leader prays:

Lord God almighty,
 bless our grandparents with long life,
 happiness, and health.
 May they remain constant in your love
 and be living signs of your presence
 to their children and grandchildren.
 We ask this through Christ our Lord.
 R/. Amen

All make the sign of the cross as the leader concludes:
 May God bless us and keep us
 all the days of our lives.
 R/. Amen

WORLD YOUTH DAY

World Youth Day will take place from
Aug. 1-6, 2023 in Lisbon, Portugal.

The location for WYD changes and a different city is chosen for each gathering. It is the Pope who chooses the city/diocese that will host each WYD, while the diocese is responsible for organizing the event in close collaboration with the Holy See, more specifically with the Dicastery for Laity, Family and Life. It is also the Holy Father who chooses the theme for each WYD and illustrates it through a message written for such purpose, thus guiding the path of preparation and the experience of the event itself. There have been 12 International World Youth Day celebrations, where the youth continue to answer the invitation of the Holy Father in staggering numbers and carry home the message received there to be Christ's light to the world.

THEME

Mary arose and went with haste. (LK 1:39)



The Christian Cross, sign of the infinite love of God for the Humankind, is the main element, where everything is born from.



The passage of the Visitation is the theme of the WYD Lisbon 2023, and it reveals us that Mary was ready to live according to God's will, being available to serve Elizabeth. This movement underlines the invitation made to the young people to renew their "inner strength, their dreams, the enthusiasm, the hope and the gratitude" (Christus Vivit, 20). Next to the path there is also a shape that evokes the Holy Spirit.



Mary is depicted as a young girl to represent the figure of the Gospel of Saint Luke (Lc 1, 39) and to enable a resemblance with the youngest. The drawing expresses the juvenility of her age, a characteristic of someone who was not a mother yet, but who is carrying the light of the world inside Her. This figure has a slight inclination, to show the compelled attitude of the Virgin Mary.



The choice of the rosary celebrates the spirituality of the Portuguese people in their devotion to Our Lady of Fátima. This is placed on the path to recall the pilgrimage experience which is so remarkable in Portugal.
