Recently I received a letter from a friend of mine who would attend St. Basil from time to time. Enclosed in her note was the following article that was obviously written some years ago because the picture of me in the article shows me with longer hair and more importantly no gray hair. I hope you find this article thought provoking.

Some food for thought:

With our nation at war we find ourselves struggling with conflicting attitudes about what life has to offer. At times we have to step back and ponder the meaning of life and our role in God's plan. As we go about our daily routine may we ponder who we are and the people and things that make our life meaningful. As I say so often, "tomorrow belongs to no one." Live in the present and know that God is with you.

Thoughts to Ponder:

The paradox of our time in history is that we have taller buildings but shorter tempers, wider freeways but narrower viewpoints. We spend more but have less—we buy more but enjoy less. We have bigger houses but smaller families; more conveniences but less time; we have more degrees but less sense, more knowledge less judgment; more experts but more problems; more medicine, but less wellness.

We've added years to life, not life to years. We've been all the way to the moon, but have trouble crossing the street to meet our new neighbor. We have conquered outer space, but not inner space. We've cleaned the air, but polluted the soul. We've split the atom but not our prejudice.

We have higher incomes but lower morals. We are long on quantity but short on quality. These are the times of tall people and short character---steep profits and shallow relationships. These are times of world peace but domestic warfare—more leisure but less fun--- more kinds of food but less nutrition. These are days of two incomes but one divorce—of fancier houses but broken homes.

It is a time when there is much in the show window and nothing in the stockroom; a time when technology can bring you a letter or a text and you can choose to make a difference of delete it.

Tuesday, August 22nd, is the feast of the Queenship of the Blessed Virgin Mary. If you are not familiar with this feast, here is some information from the Catholic News Agency:

In this feast, particularly cherished by the Popes of modern times, we celebrate Mary as the Queen of Heaven and Earth.

Pope Pius XII in the Papal Encyclical *Ad Coeli Reginam* proposed the traditional doctrine on the Queenship of Mary and established this feast for the Universal Church.

Pope Pius IX said of Mary's queenship: "Turning her maternal Heart toward us and dealing with the affair of our salvation, she is concerned with the whole human race. Constituted by the Lord Queen of Heaven and earth, and exalted above all choirs of Angels and the ranks of Saints in Heaven, standing at the right hand of Her only-begotten Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, she petitions most powerfully with Her maternal prayers, and she obtains what she seeks."

And Pope Pius XII added the following: "We commend that on the festival there be renewed the consecration of the human race to the Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Upon this there is founded a great hope that they will rejoice in the triumph of religion and in Christian peace..."

...Therefore, let all approach with greater confidence now than before, to the throne of mercy and grace of our Queen and Mother to beg help in difficulty, light in darkness and solace in trouble and sorrow...

... Whoever, therefore, honours the lady ruler of the Angels and of men - and let no one think themselves exempt from the payment of that tribute of a grateful and loving soul - let them call upon her as most truly Queen and as the Queen who brings the blessings of peace, that She may show us all, after this exile, Jesus, who will be our enduring peace and joy."

Prayer in Honor of the Queenship of Mary O Mary Immaculate Queen, look down upon this distressed and suffering world. You know our misery and our weakness. O thou who art our Mother, saving us in the hour of peril, have compassion on us in these days of great and heavy trial.

Jesus has confided to you the treasure of His grace, and through you He wills to grant us pardon and mercy. In these hours of anguish, therefore, your children come to you as their hope.

We recognize your Queenship and ardently desire your triumph. We need a Mother and a Mother's Heart. You are for us the luminous dawn which dissipates our darkness and points out the way to life. In your clemency obtain for us the courage and the confidence of which we have such need.

Most Holy and Adorable Trinity, You Who did crown with glory in Heaven the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Savior, grant that all her children on earth may acknowledge her as their Sovereign Queen, that all hearts, homes, and nations may recognize her rights as Mother and as Queen.

Mary Immaculate Queen, triumph and reign! Amen

Attention all St. Jane Frances de Chantal Volunteers Safe Environment Policy Update

The Archdiocese of Detroit has updated the Safe Environment Policy. Effective immediately, **all employees and volunteers** must read and digitally sign a Code of Conduct document, take Protecting God's Children (PGC) Training, and have a background check completed. Current volunteers who have had PGC Training in the past will need to be recertified. This can be accomplished online. You can log into your account at virtusonline.org that you created when you signed up for PGC and it will prompt you to read the Code of Conduct document, digitally sign it, and it will then guide you through the process. All new volunteers will be required to take a PGC Training session either in person or on Zoom. Go to virtusonline.org to set up a new account and it will prompt you to sign up for PGC Training. Background checks need to be done every year. Please pick up a Background Check Form in the parish office, complete it, and return it to Jody Gazo. Teen volunteers will now be required to complete a Virtus online workshop. Teen volunteers will be asked to set up an account on virtusonline.org, and they will be prompted to put in their birthdate and Virtus will assign them the Healthy Relationships for Teens 2.0 module. 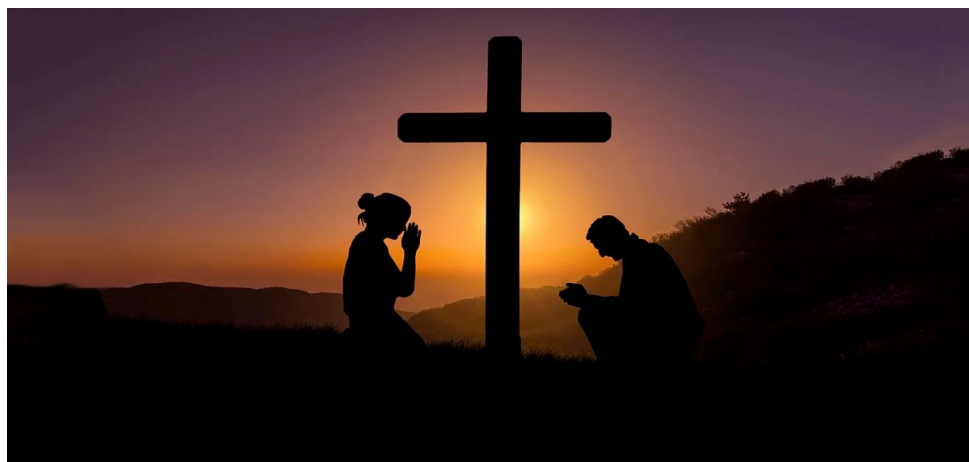
