The Lost Sheep (Lk.15:1-32)

In the Gospel from St. Luke, we recall that familiar story of the lost sheep, the one who leaves the flock of ninety-nine and wanders off and the shepherd who leaves the ninety-nine and goes in search of the one who has wandered. He searches until

he finds it and when he does find the one who was lost, he rejoices.

This is a familiar story to all of us. The “pearl” of most homilies is that God went in search of the sheep that has wandered from the fold. And we would be correct in preaching on God’s love for those who are lost.

However, the question that is often raised is, what about the ninety-nine sheep who did not wander off? That is the focal point of this reflection or meditation. Let us center our attention on the ninety-nine who did not wander off. If the Shepherd is God and the sheep are seen as the people of God, does not God love the ninety-nine as much as He loves the one that is lost or wanders off? Of course He does, however the one that was lost was in need of God’s attention more at that particular moment than were the ninety-nine who did not stray.

There are times when parents need to give more attention to one child than to their other children. Does that mean that they love their other children less? Of course not. What it does mean, is that someone in the family needed more attention at that precise moment than the others.

I can look through the daily newspapers to see there are people who are more in need of God’s attention today than I am.

I think of the men and women in the military protecting our country. They are more in need of God’s attention today than I am.

I think of people undergoing chemotherapy treatments. They are more in need of God’s attention today than I am.

I think of people who will die alone today. They are more in need of God’s attention today than I am.

I think of those who were affected by the hurricane. They are more in need of God’s attention today than I am.

I think of parents who lost a child. They are more in need of God’s attention today than I am.

I think of those people who will go without food. They are more in need of God’s attention today than I am.

As we reflect further, other people will come to mind that need God’s attention today. There are days that I do not really need God’s attention, it does not mean that He does not love me. I know that He does. However, there are days that I really need His attention and I know He is present to and for me and together we will get through the turbulent moments of life.

May we lift up in prayer those people who are most in need of God’s attention today, knowing that God loves us and will never abandon us.

Monday, August 22nd, is the feast of the Queenship of the Blessed Virgin Mary. If you are not familiar with this feast, here is some information from the Catholic News Agency:

In this feast, particularly cherished by the Popes of modern times, we celebrate Mary as the Queen of Heaven and Earth.

Pope Pius XII in the Papal Encyclical *Ad Coeli Reginam* proposed the traditional doctrine on the Queenship of Mary and established this feast for the Universal Church.

Pope Pius IX said of Mary's queenship: "Turning her maternal Heart toward us and dealing with the affair of our salvation, she is concerned with the whole human race. Constituted by the Lord Queen of Heaven and earth, and exalted above all choirs of Angels and the ranks of Saints in Heaven, standing at the right hand of Her only-begotten Son, Our Lord Jesus Christ, she petitions most powerfully with Her maternal prayers, and she obtains what she seeks."

And Pope Pius XII added the following: "We commend that on the festival there be renewed the consecration of the human race to the Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Upon this there is founded a great hope that they will rejoice in the triumph of religion and in Christian peace..."

...Therefore, let all approach with greater confidence now than before, to the throne of mercy and grace of our Queen and Mother to beg help in difficulty, light in darkness and solace in trouble and sorrow...

... Whoever, therefore, honours the lady ruler of the Angels and of men - and let no one think themselves exempt from the payment of that tribute of a grateful and loving soul - let them call upon her as most truly Queen and as the Queen who brings the blessings of peace, that She may show us all, after this exile, Jesus, who will be our enduring peace and joy."

Prayer in Honor of the Queenship of Mary O Mary Immaculate Queen, look down upon this distressed and suffering world. You know our misery and our weakness. O thou who art our Mother, saving us in the hour of peril, have compassion on us in these days of great and heavy trial.

Jesus has confided to you the treasure of His grace, and through you He wills to grant us pardon and mercy. In these hours of anguish, therefore, your children come to you as their hope.

We recognize your Queenship and ardently desire your triumph. We need a Mother and a Mother's Heart. You are for us the luminous dawn which dissipates our darkness and points out the way to life. In your clemency obtain for us the courage and the confidence of which we have such need.

Most Holy and Adorable Trinity, You Who did crown with glory in Heaven the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of the Savior, grant that all her children on earth may acknowledge her as their Sovereign Queen, that all hearts, homes, and nations may recognize her rights as Mother and as Queen.

Mary Immaculate Queen, triumph and reign! Amen

Last year in Florida, I was dubbed the 'reader walker' by a person who saw me on my daily 5-6 mile trek. I basically devour books during those times but truthfully, would probably be bored if I didn't read.

Books on tape don't cut it because: 1) one cannot hear danger approaching, and 2) my mind wanders and there goes half the book. My process is the same here in Michigan, but no one is usually around where I walk. Silence and peace are nice, sometimes, when you need a break from the world. Think about it, where can you go that you aren't immersed in music, incessant television or general noise?

Now, let's consider the opposite scenario, where you hear nothing at all or there is also the total absence of another human voice besides your own. Here's a perfect example: I just finished reading Delia Owens' 'Where the Crawdads Sing', a fabulous book. Owens, a wildlife scientist in Africa, had spent over 20 years in almost total isolation, studying the habits of animals. This is where the inspiration came for Kya, the main character. However, as an adult, Owens wondered what would happen if a child grew up that way, totally on her own. In the book, Kya's family abandons her in their remote homestead within the deep marshes of coastal North Carolina. Her mother and siblings leave before she is 6 years old, then her abusive father abandons her forever at 10 years old. Kya grows up alone with no money, few possessions, no education, and no one from whom to learn how to survive, save Mother Nature, who becomes her default teacher. Dubbed 'The Marsh Girl' she lives in a run-down shack and is shunned by those in the closest town, including the righteous 'church' people. I won't give away more of the plot, but the book forces one to consider how important human contact, specifically the human voice, is.

We often take our voice for granted, that is, until something happens and we lose it. Over the last two-plus years, with Covid robbing many of lung capacity and vocal abilities, it has been a long road back. God has given us a voice to use, I believe, for good purposes. Everyone's is different, but they are all beautiful in their own way. The last few years of my Dad's life, he was blind. I remember walking in his house with a 'Hey there, Buckaroo!!!' and his response always was, "IS that the voice I love to hear?" His hearing was all he had, and he'd wait daily to listen for the sounds of his loved ones.

The human voice. We use our voice to talk, to pray, to warn, to admonish, to express love; we use it to argue, to convince, to cheer, to provide comfort. But then we also use it to praise God through singing. It matters not if your voice is melodic or you can't carry a tune; simply remember that they who sing, pray twice.

Now that our Cantors are singing again, I am very appreciative of this fine group: Fawn, Janet, Marge, Mary, Bill, James, and Tom. Why do they do it? Here are a few responses:

"Cantors assist in setting the ambience for Mass, be it joyful, or sorrowful."
 "God has given me a gift, even as lowly as a love and appreciation of music; I am obligated to not hide it under a bushel basket."

"My role is to inspire the people to sing."
 "If not me, who? If not now, when?"
 "I'm sharing my gift of voice, with everyone."
 "I want the congregation to sing with me."

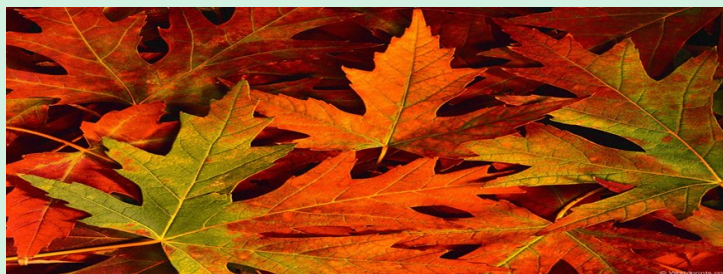

Luke 13:22-30

SIMPLE GOSPEL EXPLANATION FOR KIDS
