As of July 1, 2022 we have become a Family of Parishes. Our Family of Parishes consists of St. Rene Goupil, Our Lady of Czestochowa, SS. Cyril and Methodius and St. Jane Frances de Chantal. The priests of our family have met on several occasions to

formulate a Family Priests Covenant. It is a working document that we will use to guide us as we move forward to working together as a family. Sometime this fall, the document will be shared with the people within our family.

The covenant will be submitted to Bishop Robert Fisher in early August for his approval. Then at the end of August, the priests of our family will get together to set some dates, times and places for a presentation of our Family Priests Covenant. The priests agree that the covenant is a well thought out and well written document. As with any document, it will be reviewed and updated from time to time and will enable us to remain focused on our mission and goals.

I should say that the four parishes have been working together for the past four years on various projects and liturgical services. It is also worth noting that the priests of our family work well together and get along very well.

Archbishop Allen Vigneron has extended my appointment to St. Jane Frances de Chantal for an additional six years. This was done to allow for stability and consistency as we move forward with our mission. In 2028, it is also the year that I will turn 70 years of age and will be eligible to retire.

In the meantime, I ask that you enjoy the summer days, because they will come to an end all too soon. I ask that you also pray for our Family of Parishes. These are exciting times within the Archdiocese of Detroit. To use a nautical example we are setting out into uncharted water. But we are also comforted and challenged by the words Jesus said to Peter, "Put out into the deep and know that I am with you always".

The Holy Spirit calls us and encourages us to use our gifts and talents for the greater good of the Church and the community of faith. By our baptismal call we are encouraged to reflect upon the blessings that God has endowed all of us with and put them at the serve of the Church.

As we move forward let us trust in the power of the Holy Spirit. As Cardinal Dearden said so often, "the more difficult the task the more the Spirit will be given."

## Eucharistic Adoration with Recitation of the Divine Praises

Please join us in the main Worship Space on Tuesday, August 9<sup>th</sup>, anytime from 1:00pm until 6:30pm for Eucharistic Adoration ending with recitation of the Divine Praises at 6:30pm.

What exactly is Eucharistic Adoration and why is it important? From the United States Council of Catholic Bishops website: (<http://www.usccb.org/prayer-and-worship/prayers-and-devotions/eucharistic-devotion/index.cfm>)

"The importance of Eucharistic Adoration is shown in the fact that the Church has a ritual that regulates it: the Rite of Eucharistic Exposition and Benediction. This is an extension of the adoration of the Blessed Sacrament which occurs in every Mass: 'Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world.

Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.' Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament flows from the sacrifice of the Mass and serves to deepen our hunger for Communion with Christ and the rest of the Church. The Rite concludes with the ordained minister blessing the faithful with the Blessed Sacrament."

When you enter the Worship Space, you will find the lights are dimmed and silence is maintained. A monstrance that holds the Blessed Sacrament will be found on the Altar table, accompanied by candles. You can be seated in any open pew, socially distant from any other people.

If you are new to Eucharistic Adoration, you may wonder how long you should spend in Adoration and how you are to spend that time with the Lord. If you are starting out, try 15-20 minutes, working up to an hour over time. Spend that time in silent prayer, in thanksgiving and petition. You may also find it is beneficial to bring something to help you pray. You may choose to bring your own prayer books, read the Bible, pray the rosary, or just sit and relax and enjoy the sweet peace that comes from simply being in the Presence of God. You may feel that you can't pray well. Don't let this discourage you. The mere fact that you take time out to spend time with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament is in itself a prayer of great faith.

Please join us on Tuesday, August 9<sup>th</sup> and each month, on the second Tuesday of the month, anytime from 1:00pm to 6:30pm.

This week's readings are so full and rich with poignant caveats and advice that choosing a focus is not easy, but here we go: "If the master of the house had known the hour when the thief was coming, he would not have let his house be broken into." Isn't that the truth! How often do we utter those words "If I had only known....."? Literally, anyone would want to know in advance when their house or car was about to be looted or stolen, but how does one predict that? And so, you have to prevent and prepare in advance with security measures, locks, alarms and such. It's a pain and no one enjoys hauling around a pile of keys, but in this world there are those who want what you have.

Even with preparation, the unexpected occurs. Almost 40 years ago, when I was music director at St. Rita's in Detroit, we had a choir loft. It was locked, but of course, I would open it for Sunday Masses and for choir members to come upstairs. Rarely did anyone tackle the climb who was not a music ministry member, but it was not off-limits if someone wanted to see the organ or the view, which were both magnificent. One day, a woman came upstairs under the pretense of asking about how to speak with the priest. I gave her some helpful advice. However, I should have known better: why come up and ask me when the priest was downstairs? I was young and naïve. Normally, I would set my purse on the other side of the loft, away from the stairs. For some reason, this time, I had put it on a front pew near the door. Choir members sat next to this woman, who stayed through the opening song. I'm busy playing the music and didn't pay attention when she suddenly left. After Mass, I went to get my purse and with dismay, saw that it wasn't where it had been. The choir searched but then one member recalled the woman had taken a brown purse with her – the one right where she had been sitting. It was my purse. No one could have known that it didn't belong to her.

The rest of this story will illustrate also being prepared for when a loved one might pass away as well as to explore another nugget of wisdom in today's scriptures: "Provide money bags for yourselves that do not wear out, an inexhaustible treasure in heaven that no thief can reach nor moth destroy. For where your treasure is, there also will your heart be."

Yes, I lost some 'treasure', money and other items, including my driver's license.....and the purse itself wasn't all that valuable. It didn't take me long to realize that I also lost a treasure that was far more important than money or anything else in that bag. My mother had died the year before, and in my wallet I kept the last picture we had ever taken together, at Christmas. Back then, copying negatives to duplicate photos was an ordeal and I hadn't bothered to do it. I was crushed that I hadn't prepared better. There was little hope in recovering the bag and no way to get the picture back.....and also the sadness of discovering that even in church, something such as this can happen.

There is one bright spot: God has given us the treasured gift of memory. While I don't have the picture, to this day I can recall the image of the two of us, cheek to cheek, smiling. Our dog Nappy (Napoleon) had also stuck his face in with us....Mom loved that scrappy little mutt. I wore a red blouse because Mom felt one should always wear red at Christmas. In fact, now I recall one other long-forgotten detail: that picture was taken when I'd stopped in to see Mom and Dad just prior to Midnight Mass. She was ill at the time and couldn't go, but told me "Lulu, sing pretty for the people." Mom, I'm still trying!

A song refrain by Dan Schutte comes to mind: "I found the treasure in a field, one that time nor death can steal; I will sell all I have, give all that I am, to hold this treasure as my own."

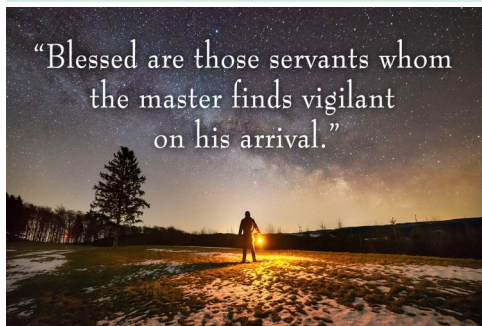

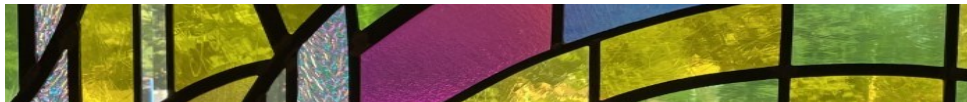

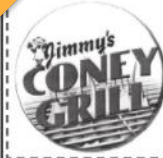
