Priesthood Sunday: You are a priest forever in the line of Melchizedek

A few years ago, I received a book entitled "Disciples Together on the Road: Words of Pope Francis for Priests" published in 2016 by Libreria Editrice Vaticana. The book is a series of talks that Pope Francis gave to priests, bishops and laity throughout his travels.

In his very down to earth style, Pope Francis explores the joys and challenges of priesthood. I have found the book to be very affirming of the role of priests in today's society and the world. I use it often as spiritual reading in my prayer life.

Today, the Catholic Church celebrates Priesthood Sunday, a day set aside to affirm the role of priests as central to the life of the church. As I reflect upon my years as a priest, I can honestly say that there have been more joyful experiences in my ministry as priest. However like any vocation or profession, we do experience the challenges that life presents to us from time to time.

As we have seen over the course of a few years, the number of priests are declining, yet the needs of the people are still being met. Children are being baptized, the dead are being buried, the sick are being anointed, men and women are being married and people have choices as to what Mass they wish to attend on any given weekend. There is no shortage of priests because as I said, peoples' spiritual needs are still being met.

God continues to call and the care of the Church is in God's hands. We are servants of God and we are called to be of service to our brothers and sisters and to the church. The one overall challenge that I have experienced throughout my priesthood, is getting people to share their gifts and their talents with the greater Church. We all have something to give and to share with the community of believers.

In a homily I gave a few weeks ago, I mentioned that we are all equal in the eyes of God. No one is greater than anyone else. Certainly we might have different responsibilities, different vocations, different titles or rank. However, at the end of the day we are seen as equals in the eyes of God. The challenge that is presented to us is how do I use my position or title or rank to build up the Body of Christ which is the Church and the community I am a part of.

As we call to mind this Priesthood Sunday, may we give praise to God for all priests who have and continue to serve the Catholic Church throughout the world. May we remember them daily in our prayers asking God to sustain them in their ministry.

May God empower us to hear His voice and respond to His call in service to the Church. By virtue of our Baptism everyone in the church is called to holiness and service.



Vigil candle donation increase

One of the beautiful traditions of the Church is the lighting of devotional or vigil candles, a symbol that represents the light of Christ. Lighting a vigil candle is a visible symbol of the prayer that accompanies it, a prayer for a specific person or yourself, for the living or the dead, for intercession or thanksgiving. Our bank of vigil candles at the back of the Worship Space is always available for your prayer needs.

Just like most everything, the cost of the candles has recently increased and freight costs that were previously avoided by purchasing in bulk



have now been passed on to the parish. As a result of these rising costs, the suggested donation for lighting a candle has increased from **\$3 to \$4**. You will see this increase beginning next week.



First, I'd like to thank all of you who have wished me well upon my retirement. I truly JJacobs@sifparish.org appreciate your kind words and thoughts whether in person or via email. I do apologize for the 'quick' notice and

departure (even though I'm technically still here until September 30th and will write one final column for next weekend), but the truth is, the decision was made just prior to Labor Day and that bulletin had already gone to press. I did not wish to announce anything on 9/11 but instead devote that column to one of the most life-changing days in our recent history. Many of you commented that you'll miss my articles, which I've always enjoyed writing. I have a website that I haven't used much in recent times, but many articles on a number of subjects are archived there: www.janinajacobs.com. Now that I'm in retirement mode, I'll hopefully post more frequently. Or, if you Google my name or also Janina Parrott Jacobs, you'll find many other articles.

As I write this, today is the funeral of Queen Elizabeth II and most likely most of you tuned in for at least some portion of it. The Queen planned every detail, including the prayer leaders, choirs, songs, the Psalms, the readings, and even the closing lament, 'Sleep, Dearie, Sleep' by Pipe Major Paul Burns - a favorite of hers who piped music to awaken her every morning outside her window. Even though the ceremony is steeped in Anglican Church traditions, you'll note there are similarities to our Catholic Liturgy of Resurrection minus, of course, the sharing of the Eucharist. It is a great idea to plan your own end-of-life wishes as well as your funeral liturgy because that's one way you'll get what you want. Quite often, family members do not have a clue about your favorite readings or music and while Fr. Tony or pastoral staff members are excellent at offering proper music selections and readings, still it is preferable to have your choice. Quite frankly, I need to do that myself as we never know when it will be our time to meet Jesus: it's on His time, not ours.

Personally, while some musicians prefer not to do funeral liturgies, I have always loved to play and sing the music for them. It is a privilege and honor to provide the consolation of music at such a time of grief. My life is always busy, but the one thing I've consistently tried to make room for, if needed and possible, is to accept that role, even to the point of cancelling other commitments. There is only one opportunity to send our loved ones to their heavenly home, and I've taken that music ministerial role very seriously. Why? Because for those left here on earth, burying a loved one hurts. Prayer and music comforts. Fr. Tony's words bring peace, especially his sung Commendation at the end of Mass, "May the angels welcome you to paradise, may the martyrs greet you on your way; may you see the face of the Lord this day, Alleluia, Alleluia! Saints of God, come and lead you, to the holy city, the new and eternal Jerusalem, Alleluia, Alleluia!"

I'd also like to praise the Ushers and Funeral Ministry teams who are always there to help with Mass and welcome parishioners and visitors to our parish at both funerals and weekend masses. Not every church has this ministry and when one is a stranger in a different church and doesn't know where to go, that human contact and support is vital.

Death is a part of life and while none of us want to leave this beautiful world, it is God's plan for us to do so and He knows what is best.




