Today we begin the season of Advent. Advent is a word with Latin roots. It means "approach" or "coming." But what is Advent, really? Advent is the beginning of the new liturgical year for the Roman Catholic Church. On the first Sunday of Advent the Church celebrates its own kind of New Year's Day. Advent begins each year on the Sunday closest to November 30th, which is the feast day of Saint Andrew the Apostle. We also begin a new cycle of readings on the first Sunday of Advent, this year focusing on the Gospel of Matthew.



What are we to do during Advent? Advent is given to us as a time to prepare our souls for the coming of the Lord. We are called to examine our lives in the light of Christ. Are we seeking to become more like Christ? St. John Henry Newman (our newest Saint!) said, "May each Christmas, as it comes, find us more and more like him, who at this time became a little child for our sake, more simple-minded, more humble, more holy, more affectionate, more resigned, more happy, more full of God." I think that quote gives us a solid foundation for what to do during Advent to prepare our souls for the coming of the Lord.

As we celebrate the season of Advent, here is what's going on at St. Jane Frances:

 the Sunday liturgies during our prayers. During this hour, time will
 be taken to: read the scripture, reflect on the meaning,

- CHRISTMAS SEASON DECORATING Please mark your calendars for Sunday, December 22nd, following the 11:30am Mass. At that time we will bring Christmas to light in our beautiful worship space. Here is a blessing of an Advent Wreath from the Catholic Household Blessing and Prayers: The blessing of an Advent Wreath takes place on the First Sunday



of Advent or on the evening before the First Sunday of Advent. When the blessing of the Advent Wreath is celebrated in the home, it is appropriate that it be blessed by a parent or another member of the family. All make the sign of the cross as the leader says: Our help is in the name of the Lord.

Response (R/.) Who made heaven and earth.
Then the Scripture, <u>Isaiah 9:</u> (lines 1-2 and 5-6) or <u>Isaiah</u>
63 (lines 16-17 & 19) or <u>Isaiah 64</u> (lines 2-7) is read.
Following the reading, with hands joined, the leader says:

Lord our God,

we praise you for your Son, Jesus Christ:
he is Emmanuel, the hope of the peoples,
he is the wisdom that teaches and guides us,
he is the Savior of every nation.

Lord God,

let your blessing come upon us
as we light the candles of this wreath.
May the wreath and its light
be a sign of Christ's promise to bring us salvation.
May he come quickly and not delay.
We ask this through Christ our Lord.
R/. Amen.

The blessing may conclude with a verse from "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel":
O come, desire of nations, bind in one the hearts of humankind; bid ev'ry sad division cease and be thyself our Prince of peace.
Rejoice! Rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to thee, O Israel.

Flu shot: Your best bet for avoiding influenza

Getting a flu shot often protects you from coming down with the flu. And although the flu shot doesn't always provide total protection, it's worth getting.

Influenza is a respiratory infection that can cause serious complications, particularly to young children, older adults and people with certain medical conditions. Flu shots are the most effective way to prevent influenza and its complications. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends that everyone 6 months of age or older be vaccinated annually against influenza.

When is the flu vaccine available?

It is available now. It takes up to two weeks to build immunity after a flu shot, but you can benefit from the vaccine even if you don't get it until after the flu season starts.

Why do I need to get vaccinated every year?

New flu vaccines are released every year to keep up with rapidly adapting flu viruses. Because flu viruses evolve so quickly, last year's vaccine may not protect you from this year's viruses. After vaccination, your immune system produces antibodies that will protect you from the vaccine viruses. In general, though, antibody levels start to decline over time — another reason to get a flu shot every year.

Who should get the flu vaccine?

The CDC recommends annual influenza vaccinations for everyone age 6 months or older. Vaccination is especially important for people at high risk of influenza complications, including pregnant women, older adults, and young children. Chronic medical conditions also can increase your risk of influenza complications, such as cancer or cancer treatment, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD), cystic fibrosis, diabetes, obesity and HIV/AIDs. Check with your doctor before receiving a flu vaccine you are allergic to eggs, or if you had a severe reaction to a previous flu vaccine.

Can the vaccine give me the flu?

No. The flu vaccine can't give you the flu. But you might develop flu-like symptoms — despite getting a flu shot — for a variety of reasons, including:

Reaction to the vaccine. Some people experience muscle aches and a fever for a day or two after receiving a flu shot. This may be a side effect of your body's production of protective antibodies.

The two-week window. It takes about two weeks for the flu shot to take full effect. If you're exposed to the influenza virus shortly before or during that time period, you might catch the flu

Mismatched flu viruses. In some years, the influenza viruses used for the vaccine don't match the viruses circulating during the flu season. If this occurs, your flu shot will be less effective, but may still offer some protection.

Other illnesses. Many other diseases, such as the common cold, also produce flu-like symptoms. So you may think you have the flu when you actually don't.

What kind of protection does the flu vaccine offer?

How well the flu vaccine works can vary. The flu vaccine is generally more effective among healthy children age 2 and older and adults age 64 and younger. Some older people and people with certain medical conditions may develop less immunity after receiving a flu shot.

According to the CDC, in past flu seasons when the match between the flu vaccine and circulating strains of flu virus is close, a flu shot is 40 to 60 percent effective in reducing the risk of getting influenza among people of all ages.





Happy New Year! Last week we saw Jesus as the King, and this week we begin again, waiting for the Christ child to come, but wait, He has been here already, almost 2000 years ago. So, we are celebrating His birth, but also remembering His promise to come again at the end of time.

We have been called, the question is, have we heard that call, are we ready? In our Calendar's New Year (January 1st) many of us make New Year's Resolutions. How many do this for this New Year? Not many, I bet; but aren't we called to be more, for us, for our family, for the Church, for the world? Make a resolution this Advent to make a change. Pray a little more—start with an "easily" achievable goal, say 5 minutes extra a day. Put together an Advent Wreath to have in a visible place of your home, where you can light candles and remind others that we are Christ's light in the world today. Create an Advent calendar of your own, that challenges you spiritually each day of Advent. Make an effort to say "Thank You" and "Your Welcome", how about (gasp...) "God Bless You" more each day, and then offer those, that you say these things to, up in a short prayer to God for their health and well being.

"Little things" that grow into bigger things. Volunteer to help in a ministry that you might be nervous about. Instead of making enough food for your family, make a little more and visit an elderly neighbor with dinner. Wake up in the morning, stretch and welcome the day, dedicating it to God. This is where we start, in smaller, almost imperceptible ways to our notion of time, money and self; then as these smaller things become "the norm" - do a little more. Bring a friend along and challenge them to a contest of holding one another accountable.

In these ways we develop habits, a little bit at a time, and these good habits can turn into virtues where we shine our faith for the world to see. The readings from this weekend tell us to be prepared-

for at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come."

Mathew 24:44(b)

We will be prepared, because we started early. We started living better lives than the world expected, because our end-game is eternity. Our "New Year" begins early, let's use this time to show the world what we are made of.

As we wait for the "coming wind" (ad ventus) of Christ, let us be wise in our preparations, and let us spread the Good News (Gospel—evangelion) of Jesus's victory over death for us, and for all.


