# GAUDETE SUNDAY!

What's that you ask? "The Third Sunday of Advent (Like the Fourth Sunday of Lent) is a day of joy in the midst of our spiritual preparations for Christmas. It is traditionally called Gaudete Sunday, from the Latin of the Entrance Antiphon for today. The antiphon captures the mood of the entire liturgy as we move

into the second part of Advent: there is a sense of joyful expectation, an awareness that the fulfillment of God's great plan for us is near" (Sourcebook for Sundays. Seasons and Weekdays, 2020).

There is a joyful sense in today's readings. Isaiah sings a song of rebirth today, describing Israel after the exile. Flowers bloom, disabilities are healed, sorrow turns to joy. The letter of James counsels us to be patient during this transformation. In the Gospel, Jesus reminds John's disciples that he has done just what Isaiah prophesied. What's more, the kingdom of heaven promises greatness for all. As we reflect on God's word, let us rejoice, for we know that God is with us.

As we rejoice, we also must prepare. We prepare for the coming of the Son of God, into the world, into our hearts, and at the end of time. Let us try to put aside all the busyness and craziness of the season and concentrate on preparing our hearts for the divine presence in us and among us.

I will stand up for my convictions and speak out when I witness language that disparages others' dignity, while also listening and seeking to understand others' experiences.



Happy Gaudete Sunday, the beginning of a week for rejoicing! What do you have to rejoice about? Me? I'm fairly healthy, I have pretty much all of the things that I need (sanity is a little fleeting at times, but...), the things that I "want" are not necessities, my friends are very patient and understanding and I really have a great family. I can rejoice that I have really and truly been blessed in my life.

Phillipians 4:4

We all have ups and downs, we all have good days and bad, but what our Christian Philosophy asks us is: what do we (as individuals) choose to let "rule" our lives? If we allow the bad things to be at the forefront of our lives, the aches and pains, the sullen and grumpy, the sorrow and misery; THAT is what our lives will resemble: broken down, grouchy, gloomy lives that have nothing to look forward to. Now, if the good things in our lives drive us in the world, and the "bad" take a back seat, we become happier, cheerier people, even if we ache and are stiff.
