**Before Donating:**

- ◆ Get a good nights sleep
- ◆ Have a good breakfast or lunch
- ◆ Drink extra water & fluids to replace the volume you will donate
- ◆ Eat iron rich foods
- ◆ Avoid fatty foods

**During Donation:**

- ◆ Wear clothing with sleeves that can be raised above the elbow
- ◆ Show the staff any "good veins" that have been used successfully in the past to draw blood
- ◆ Relax
- ◆ Take the time to enjoy a snack and a drink in the refreshments area immediately after donating

**After Donation:**

- ◆ Re-hydrate by drinking plenty of fluids over the next 24-48 hours
- ◆ Avoid strenuous physical activity or heavy lifting for about 5 hours after donation

## Did you know...

**World Day of Peace** is a feast day of the Roman Catholic Church dedicated to universal peace. It is held on the **1<sup>st</sup> of January**, the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God. Pope Paul VI established it in 1967, being inspired by the encyclical *Pacem in Terris* of Pope John XXIII and with reference to his own encyclical *Populorum Progressio*. The day was first observed on January 1, 1968.

World Day of Peace often has been an occasion on which the Popes made magisterial declarations of social doctrine. Pope Paul VI and Pope John Paul II made important declarations on the Day in each year of their pontificates regarding the United Nations, human rights, women's rights, labor unions, economic development, the right to life, international diplomacy, peace in the Holy Land Israel, globalization, and terrorism.
