And palms before my feet.

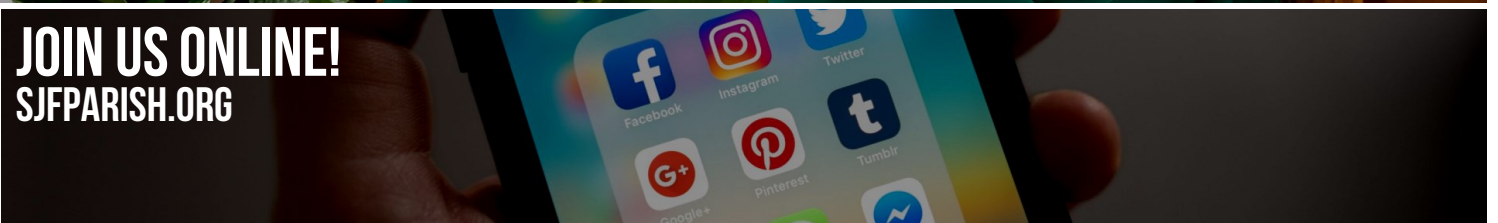

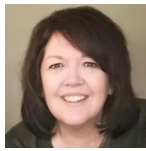

This Lent we continue on our journey to holiness, a life led as a reflection of the love and teachings of Jesus Christ, made possible by the grace given us in the Sacraments.

Our review of the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist) is completed this week with the Sacrament of Eucharist. The relationship that God began with us in the Sacrament of Baptism and strengthened in Confirmation is regularly nourished by the Eucharist.

The Church calls the Eucharist the “Most Holy Sacrament” or the “Sacrament of sacraments” (CCC 1330) because of Christ’s unique presence in it. Eucharist comes from the Greek word “Eucharistia” which means thanksgiving.

In the Sacrament of Eucharist, we, as members of the common priesthood of all the faithful (discussed in the article on the Sacrament of Baptism), make a spiritual offering of our lives in union with the perfect sacrifice of Christ. Our offering is now made efficacious; it is received by God. We then receive Christ and, as Christ-bearers, are united to one another. Reception of Eucharist makes the Catholic a “Christ-bearer.” As such, it is a repeatable sacrament.

At Mass each week, we hear of Christ’s institution of the Sacrament of Eucharist at the Last Supper, described in the Gospels of Matthew (26:26-29), Mark (14:22-25), and Luke (22:15-20). In the sacrifice of the Mass, Christ is present in the priest, the community gathered, the Scriptures, and in the Eucharistic elements of bread and wine. In the presence of the gathered community, through the words and actions of the priest, acting in the person of Christ, “the substance of the bread and wine becomes the substance of Christ’s body and blood, while the appearances of bread and wine remain” (CCC 137-77). This action by God is called transubstantiation.

The Church has proclaimed this truth since the council of Trent in the fourteenth century: “After the consecration of the bread and wine, our Lord Jesus Christ, true God and man, is truly, really, and substantially contained under the species of those sensible things” (Council of Trent 13). Believing in these truths is necessary to validly receive the Eucharist. The proper disposition for reception of communion is to be baptized, Catholic, in a state of grace, and hungry for God!

The matter of the Eucharist is unleavened wheat bread and natural grape wine mixed with a drop of water. The form of the sacrament is the words of consecration, proclaimed by the bishop or priest at the Liturgy of the Eucharist. The ordinary minister is the bishop or priest. Lay persons who distribute Holy Communion are formed and commissioned and are referred to as Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion.

It is important to note under our current circumstances that, “Since Christ is sacramentally present under each of the species, communion under the species of bread alone makes it possible to receive all the fruit of Eucharistic grace” (CCC 1390).

When we receive the Eucharist, we are nourished or fed by God. Just as food provides physical benefits including nourishing the body, stimulating growth, promoting strength, and giving joy, the Eucharist preserves the life of the soul, increases the life of grace, cures spiritual diseases of the soul, helps us grow closer to Jesus and one another, and gives us spiritual joy in the service of Christ.

When we consume food, we are not changed according to the food; when we consume the body and blood of Christ, we are changed according to Christ!

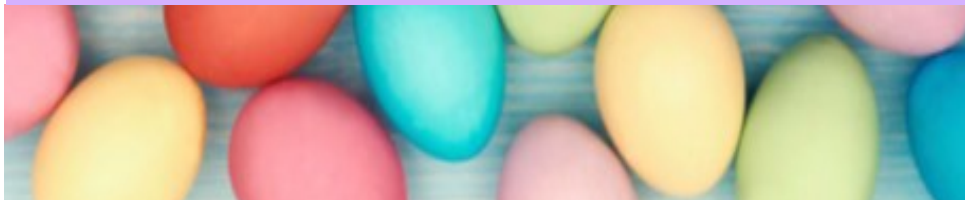
Through the reception of the Eucharist, we are transformed: strengthened in our relationship with Christ, separated from sin and fortified to help us avoid future sin, united with our brothers and sisters, and nourished to fulfill our call to be Christ in the world, including participating in acts of corporal and spiritual mercy. In the Eucharist we celebrate the power of the transforming love of God in our lives and are nourished to follow our call to holiness, living out our lives as members of the Body of Christ, a reflection of Christ in the world.

This Lenten season (and into Easter), as we explore the seven sacraments, we hope that you will come to a deeper understanding and appreciation for the way God speaks to us through the sacraments and for the great grace they impart. Next week we will look at the Sacraments of Healing, beginning with Reconciliation.

You've likely heard of a 'clean sweep'? Sometimes the term is used in sports competitions when one team decisively wins over another....for example when the

Detroit Tigers take a whole series from another team. Another way the term is used is when taking on a task from top to bottom and really giving it a 'clean sweep', such as getting rid of all your junk, or in spring cleaning.

Yet another version is quite literal. If you have a garage and are lucky enough to be able to park your car(s) inside all winter, you will certainly relate to this: after driving throughout a Michigan winter, there comes a time when you see all the dirt and salt that has accumulated over the months from the snowstorms, then the aftermath when it falls off your car and remains on the garage floor. Every day when you go to get into your car, you might heave a great sigh at what a job it will be to clean it up. Why? Because you know that to do it right it will take hours and a lot of effort.

Last week, I couldn't take another day of all the mud and grime collecting under our cars, so I got out the broom, dustpan, mop, mop bucket, and soap. I decided to hook up a hose to the garage sink in order to rinse everything out....or it would take forever to fill up buckets of rinse water. Then, I figured out I'd have to rid the floor of any 'stuff' – boxes, dog food container and biscuits, golf clubs, car vacuums or anything electrical so that it wouldn't get wet. This was turning into quite a project.

As I began sweeping, my hubby came out and asked 'why all the sweeping?' when I could simply wash the floor and get rid the dirt with soapy water? Well, it doesn't work that way. If you take that shortcut and don't first sweep and remove the dirt, you won't get a clear floor, and will ultimately end up with dirty streaks, smudges and mop marks on your floor. It will not be attractive, nor clean.

As I continued on with my task, a sudden thought occurred to me: THIS is what Lent is all about. There are no shortcuts to a clean soul and heart. If we don't follow the principles of the season or God's teachings, taking stock of yourself and what needs fixing....doing that clean sweep....we really aren't taking advantage of being washed clean at the great feast of Easter. We've got to get rid of the underlying dirt of sin and then be ready to receive the light of Christ and His healing holy waters.

Yes, it took a long time to move everything, to sweep the garage, to fill countless mop buckets with soap and water, and hose everything down to rinse it properly, then squeegee the water out. But after it was all completed, I had a beautifully clean floor. Was it worth the effort? Yes. It will assuredly be worth the effort to get ourselves 'swept clean' for the remainder of Lent as well.

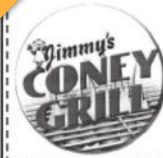
