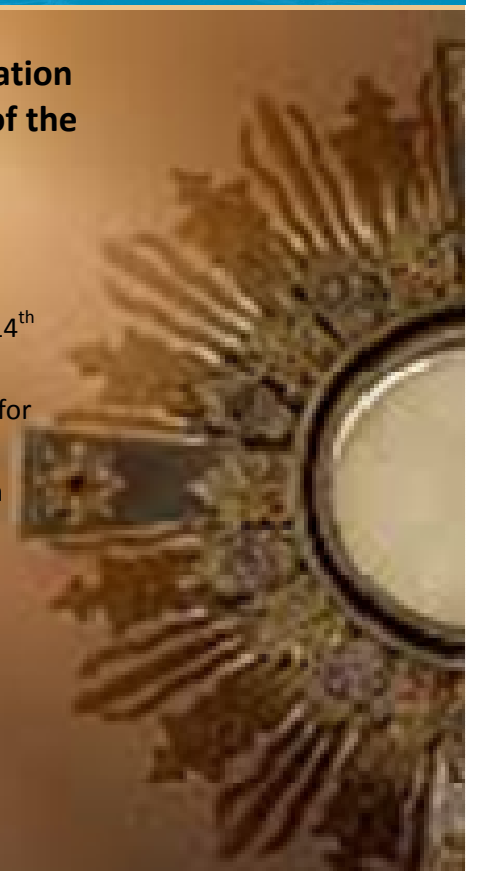

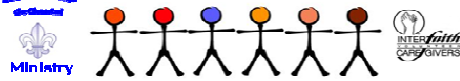

WHAT IS THE DENIS CONNECTION?

The Denis Connection started with an idea that I had after my brother passed away. His name was Dennis and I feel he died of loneliness. It made me realize that since I was the only person who spent time with him, that one person is not enough. People need people. I named the ministry after my brother which stands for “Delivering Encouragement, Nurturing and Increasing Socialization”. We started as a visiting ministry but have now expanded to providing transportation to appointments and errands. In this day, many people have their family out of the area, working full time, or sometimes are estranged. There is no judgment or shame in asking for help; that is why we are here. We currently have 29 volunteers and since our start in May, 2016, we have served 52 clients. There is no cost to you for these services.

If you think the DENIS Connection could be of help to you, please contact the parish office and we will do our best to help with your request.

If you would like to become a volunteer, we would love to have you join us. This is a ministry that you can choose the amount of time you can devote to it. Training will be provided to help you feel comfortable with this ministry.

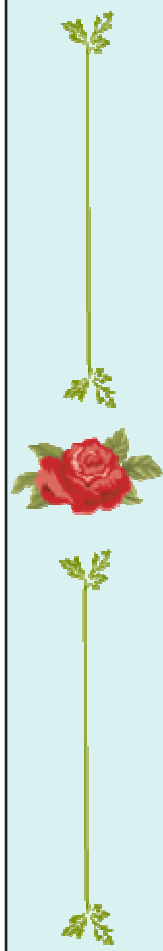


GRIEF MINISTRY

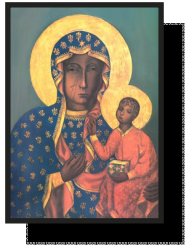

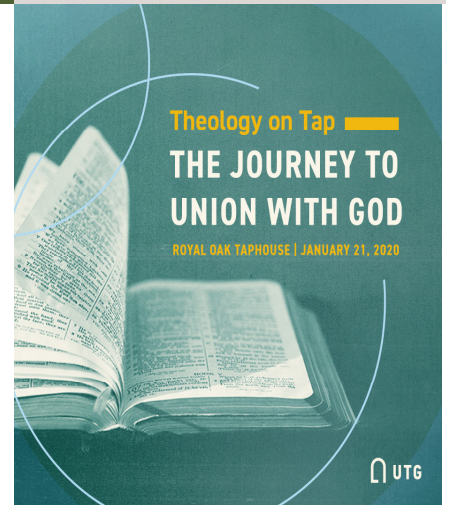

ABOUT THE GOSPEL:

Jesus was baptized, then confirmed when the Holy Spirit came upon him. God's voice says Jesus is his "beloved Son." Jesus didn't need to be baptized, but he wanted to show us how important Baptism is. This is the first time we see (in Scripture) the Father, Son and Holy Spirit mentioned together.

IN CHURCH:

Make the Sign of the Cross. As you do so, think about each Person of the Blessed Trinity.

QUESTIONS FOR THE WEEK:

- ◆ What does it mean to you to be part of God's family?
- ◆ What happens, for us, at Baptism? Do you know what the priest or deacon asked when you were baptized?
- ◆ What makes belonging to the Christian community important to you?

FAMILY PRAYER:

God, thank you for inviting us to join your family. Help our family live holy lives, spread your love, and be kind to one another.

QUESTIONS TO ASK YOURSELF NEXT WEEK, IN PREPARATION FOR MASS:

- ◆ What do you thank God for?
- ◆ What activities does your family like to do together?
- ◆ What makes a good person? What makes a good friend? What makes a good student?

Baptism, the welcoming of us into the Christian life. Often in the Catholic Church, we are baptized as infants, our parents make the promise to raise us and teach us about our Catholic Faith. We *must* be baptized (and sometimes need to profess our following of the Catholic Faith) to receive any of the other Sacraments, but is reception of the Sacrament(s) all that we need to do, or is there more?

When we receive a Sacrament, we receive Grace from God. A free gift from Him, because nothing that we do can ever make us "worthy" to receive this gift. What did you do with your gift of Grace? If you are like me, much of grace received seems to get tucked away and unfortunately forgotten. What if we rediscovered these Graces? What if we took part, more fully in our personal reception and utilization of God's Graces?

Jesus. Did He really "need" to be baptized? This is a Theological question that I really do not need to get into, but the fact remains that Jesus—fully God and fully human—went to His cousin John, and asked John to baptize Him. Even John was taken aback and in Matthew 3:14 (from this week's Gospel) he asked,

"I need to be baptized by you, and yet you are coming to me?"

Jesus willingly accepted John's baptism, in my mind, to show me the way; To show us a different path; To lead us through His example, even though He is God's Son; A way to come into oneness with Him. The Catechism of the Catholic Church says, in paragraph 1123:

"The purpose of the sacraments is to sanctify men, to build up the body of Christ and, finally, to give worship to God... they also nourish, strengthen and express (faith)."

We get the chance to confirm our faith—formally in the Sacrament of Confirmation, but also informally each day when we choose to follow God's Commandments. When we choose God's way, which is many times not the easiest way, we tell the world that there is more than just this small life that we live here, that there is a greater purpose to our lives than just being here, now. Each of us show the world an example (good or bad) of what a Catholic is.

We state it in our sacraments, and we receive God's Grace through the Sacraments, what do we do with it then? Will we humble ourselves, following the example of Jesus? Will we put these graces into action in our lives? Will we take the more difficult path, the one less traveled? Will we give of ourselves for others? What do we choose to do with God's Grace?

Happy New Year (again), and may the return on your faith investment show you many returns in this upcoming year!

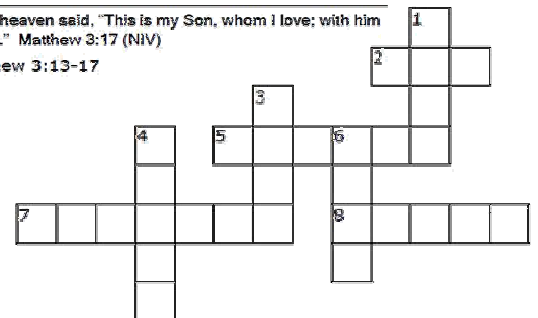


