#### Thanksgiving Day at St. Leo's-Soup Kitchen Ministry

Volunteers from St. Jane Frances will be going to St. Leo's in Detroit to prepare and serve Thanksgiving lunch/ dinner to those hungry guests living in that area. <u>Please</u> <u>mark your calendars for Thanksgiving Day, November 28<sup>th</sup>.</u> This has been a tradition for St. Jane Soup Kitchen Ministry for over 16 years without omission. In order for a successful meal service, we need 20 **adult volunteers maximum** to sign up. Similar to last year, volunteers will serve turkey with mushroom gravy, turkey stuffing, mostaccioli, green beans, yams, and cranberry sauce. Additionally, we will be baking corn bread at St. Jane to serve with the meal.

As always, VOLUNTEERS MUST SIGN-UP at the parish office. You can do this in person or by calling the office (586) 977-8080 and asking to be placed on the list. St. Leo's has an age requirement. <u>You must be at least 16 years old to volunteer for St. Leo's service.</u>

If you sign-up to serve and wish to carpool, we will meet in the South parking lot, at <u>8:15am</u> and form groups with volunteer drivers to carpool. We will leave by 8:30am. <u>DRIVERS ARE NEEDED</u>. At St. Leo's, meals are served from 11:30am to 12:30pm with clean-up following. We will return to the St. Jane Frances parking lot around 1:30pm.

Unused Prescription and OTC Medications Unused Wound Care Products Collection November 2-17, 2019

# Do you have unused medications or wound care dressings in your home??

The Health Ministry at St. Jane Frances will be collecting prescriptions and over the counter medications (OTC) as well as wound care products (dressings, tape, ace bandages, etc.) again. They will be taken to the *Soup Kitchen, to the pharmacist there who assists with the needs of the less fortunate.* Please bring your unused medications and wound care products to the church office any time during the above dates.

#### Rules for medication drop off:

- Original prescription bottles with labels intact. We must be able to read the drug name, dosage, date, and pharmacy that dispensed the prescription. Please block out your name before bringing the bottles to church.
- 2. Expired dates on labels are accepted. The pharmacist will determine if it is still usable.
- 3. Unused over the counter (OTC) medicines are also accepted.
- 4. NO LIQUIDS.
- 5. NO NARCOTICS OR CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES

Controlled substances are those with the potential for psychological or physical dependence. Examples include: narcotic painkillers such as Morphine, Vicodin, Oxycontin, Demerol, Tylenol III with codeine; anti-depressants, and ADHD drugs such as Ritalin.

#### Rules for wound care products drop off:

- 1. Original packages, unopened if packaged as sterile.
- 2. No liquids or ointments.

# Faith Formation Reminder:

Confirmation Preparation: We begin meeting again on Tuesday, November 12<sup>th</sup> at 6:00pm I am not a scripture scholar. I am not a philosopher, a theologian or even an expert in any single field. What I am, is someone who likes to ask questions and learn the answers! I will ask a question about anything. Why do we drive on the right side of the road? Why don't we have roof "rafters", like a house, in the church? Why is the black wire generally the powered line and the white wire the "common" wire in Romex?

Sometimes it is the oddest things that fascinate me! So this week, I asked, "who the heck were the Maccabees?" of the first (OT) reading at Mass? It turns out that it is a simple (not so simple) answer. As the world progressed through time, the political powers that be, waxed and waned all across the East. The Greek Empire of Alexander the Great crumbled and split, and Judea (much of present day Israel) was stuck between warring states. One side won the "war" and tried to force Judea to accept their customs. The book of Maccabees is written about a group of Judean warriors who fought against the moral repugnancies that they were being told, that they had to follow.

Our first reading splits a story of a single family, a mother and her seven (7) sons who refused to turn away from God. They refused to worship another (false) god and refused to disobey the moral laws that they believed in. Even when their family was literally wiped out one by one, they all stayed true to God, because they knew that God ruled Eternally and that the "powers" of man were only of this world.

People were always trying to trick Jesus! In this week's Gospel the Sadducees (a certain group of priests) were trying to get Jesus to goof up, but their plans didn't work. Jesus upheld that this life is only a tiny part of God's Eternal plan for us, should we choose to accept and follow His Will freely.

Let us be like the family of the first reading, so steadfast in Faith that we find comfort in God's Promises to and for us eternally, that nothing in this world will be able to sway us from His righteous path!
