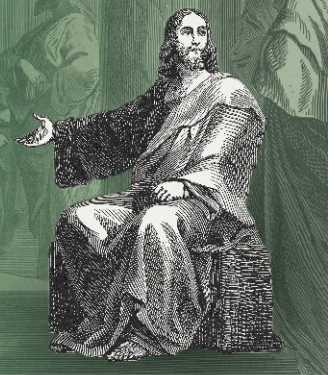

Fr. T's Tidbits: Retreat

Last week I was on my annual priest retreat in Arlington, Texas and had the opportunity to reconnect with some friends of mine. I always find it beneficial to make a retreat in November as I prepare to celebrate the anniversary of my ordination as a priest.

As I reflect upon the past thirty-three years I can say without a doubt that the church has changed. When I was in seminary the idea of closing or merging parishes or parishes without a priest was not even thought of in those days.

In the years since my ordination I have seen a lot and have witnessed God's presence in people's lives and the many people I met along the way who invited me to journey with them. These are people who shared their joys and challenges, their struggles and pain and their losses and new life. One of the many joys of priesthood are the people God places in our lives to build us up, to affirm us and to challenge us.

I was recently asked why I became a priest. I could ask that same question of any occupation. Why do some people become teachers or lawyers or doctors? Why do some people enter into marriage while others remain single? The simplest answer when asked why priesthood is: because it feels right. You have to enjoy what you are called to do. I enjoy being a priest. This is not to say that there aren't challenges from time to time. In my thirty-three years as a priest I have had my share of disappointments and frustrations. In every walk of life there are difficulties and issues to deal with. Yet when everything is said and done life is still wonderful.

At my first Mass in the parish church I was raised, St. Phillip Neri, (now closed), I asked my family and friends to pray for me that I may respond to whatever the church may ask of me. God has a plan for each of us and we have to let God be God and stay out of his way.

I often wonder what the Catholic Church will look like in 10 years. We can speculate and gauge what it might be and how it will look and that is our nature as human beings. Yet, in doing that we fail to live in the present because we are looking toward a future that has yet to come.

As we prepare to celebrate the Feast of Christ the King and embark upon the Season of Advent may we prepare our hearts and minds to receive Christ today and every day amid the joys and challenges of our life! For it is in Christ that we are strengthened and renewed. Have a great day.

Sound System

You may have noticed a different, clearer sound in church recently so let me explain a little bit about that. Since I arrived last September (yes, it has already been over a year!), I've heard complaints about the sound system...too loud, too quiet, too muffled, buzzing, feedback...etc. I am not a sound technician but know enough to know what I *don't* know, and with a complex digital system, there are many facets to consider. Yes, we could get the professionals in and pay a lot of money, but we need to watch expenditures. The solution came to me a few months ago from, of all places.....social media.

Detroit Music Ministers have a private website where we can share all kinds of info, thoughts, and ideas. In fact, it was that website which brought me to St. Jane. One of your former music directors, Greg Crachiolo, messaged me in June 2018 about the open position. Had he not done so, I probably would not be here. Greg and I kept in touch and when I asked about the sound system, he said it was put in during his time at St. Jane. Since he knew the system well, he offered to come in and help. That finally happened Sunday, October 26th for about two hours after Mass.

It is not an easy task to balance a sound system. You cannot simply move microphones, turn knobs and dials to get proper sound. You may note that when major artists perform in concert, it probably takes their sound people longer to set up than it does for them to perform! With Greg's expertise and the help of John Martin, Bob and Joyce Youngert, Tom Harris, and Jan Machusak, we made some great headway into getting better sound out of the system. We had everyone sing, proclaim the word, and stand in various parts of the church under different areas and speakers in order to get the best results. Fr. Tony also came so that we could get his lapel microphone configured properly and that his homilies are more clearly recorded. We don't have it perfected yet, but are getting there. There's still far more I don't know about the system than what I do, but Greg has offered to continue to bring me up to speed. You may not think of things this way, but this is simply another form of Unleashing the Gospel: people helping people so that we can all enjoy better worship experiences...and that includes proper sound. A big Thank You goes out to Greg and all of my sound helpers.

Wednesday December 4th**



Once again, the end of the year is upon us! Our readings have been sounding a little bleaker (I mean seven brothers and their mother were tortured and put to death in the first reading last week for their beliefs!) The Catholic Church, the Christian faithful, have been guilty of such atrocities as well—the Crusades, the Inquisition, storied parts of our past like the Salem Witch Trials, is our God the one who instructs us to Love, or to wipe out? As far as I remember, our God IS Love.

I know guys, all this squishy, mushy "Love" talk has gotta end, but just hear me out. This past week, I was feeling it and my sister texted me that for some reason she was really missing my Dad, and whoa... I was thinking the same thing. His death was pretty sudden, even though he had been ailing for a bit of time. My 6'3", 250 lb dad, who would swing 50 lb blocks of steel around as if they were empty boxes, was getting weaker and slower. I saw the signs and was preparing myself for his eventual passing, but not that quick and sudden. TONS of people visited at the Funeral home and Mass, many cards and letters have been sent. These are the things that prepare us and help us through.

In the Gospel this week, Jesus foretells the destruction of the temple. The people (being human beings) are fearful and ask the 500 questions of when, where, why, and how. Jesus tells them of signs leading to the end and He says, "you are not to prepare your defense beforehand, for I myself shall give you a wisdom in speaking," (Lk 21:14b-15a). This wisdom in speaking comes from our life lived now. How we treat others Now, how we behave Now, the truths that we orient ourselves to NOW. THIS gives us the strength of integrity and wisdom when we are tested. When we are strong in God's Word and teachings, the Holy Spirit speaks through us easier and more freely, because He IS who we are/will be during these tests and trials.

I know where my Dad is, because of his faith. I still pray for him and ask for his help, as I know he did for me as I was growing up. This is the Love of which I speak—agape—a benevolent love. God's Love for each of us, Christian and non-Christian alike. Can we live up to that standard? Not alone! We need to be there for each other, because we do not know the hour of the end, we can only be ready for it! I'll see you on the journey!
