Fr. T's Tidbits: Convocation

Since 1985, every other year, the presbyterate (the body of priests) of the Archdiocese of Detroit, gather with the Archbishop and the auxiliary bishops. Every convocation involves having a speaker who leads us through a particular topic and we have a spiritual director for the week long convocation. It is a time to renew old friendships and create new ones. It is also a time in which we gather for prayer and Mass to celebrate our priesthood and to remember those brother priests who have died since the last convocation and to celebrate those who were ordained in the past two years. This year 210 priests have registered for the convocation.

The convocation begins in the evening of October 13th and goes through October 18th. As we gather know that you are in my prayers as I hope I am in yours. The convocation is not all work, there will be some free time to relax and catch up with brother priests we have not seen for awhile.

The last few years as you are aware have been challenging years for the priesthood and for the church amid the abuse scandal. And I know it has not been easy for you as well. We will get through the abuse scandal together. The convocation affords the priests of Detroit to focus on the mission to which the Lord has called them. Sometimes in the midst of all that is happening in the world, the church or our local community, we can lose sight of our call and our mission and the enthusiasm for it. Sometimes we need to get out of our element to renew and gain refreshment for our self. As you have heard me say so often, it is God's work we are about and not our own.

I have attended each of the convocations since they began. There are two topics that are prevalent throughout the convocation. The priests who are in parishes will boast about their parishioners and how blessed they are to be in their parish. Secondly, there is a great bond and brotherhood in the priesthood. It is a wonderful fraternity to be a part of. I ask that you pray for all of us as we gather for this year's convocation. Know that I will be praying for you. Have a great week and enjoy the Autumn season.

TIPS FOR A GOOD DONATION EXPERIENCE

Before Donating:

- ◆ Get a good nights sleep
- ◆ Have a good breakfast or lunch
- ◆ Drink extra water & fluids to replace the volume you will donate
- ◆ Eat iron rich foods
- ◆ Avoid fatty foods

During Donation:

- ◆ Wear clothing with sleeves that can be raised above the elbow
- ◆ Show the staff any “good veins” that have been used successfully in the past to draw blood
- ◆ Relax
- ◆ Take the time to enjoy a snack and a drink in the refreshments area immediately after donating.

After Donation:

- ◆ Re-hydrate by drinking plenty of fluids over the next 24-48 hours
- ◆ Avoid strenuous physical activity or heavy lifting for about 5 hours after donation

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS

ULTRASOUND MACHINE PROGRAM—October 19th & 20th

The purpose of the program is to purchase a brand new ultrasound machine for a Pro-Life Women's Clinic. For each new machine purchased by a Knights of Columbus Council, District, or State Council, the Supreme Council will pay half of the cost of the machine.

The ultrasound machine is used to show the image of a child to the mother. If a woman is shown the image of her unborn child, there is an 80% plus chance that she will decide to keep the baby rather than terminate if she is considered 'abortion minded'.

This is why the St. Jane Frances de Chantal Knights of Columbus council 13340 is having a drive to raise money to purchase an ultrasound machine. The weekend of **October 19th & 20th**, we will be giving out "Baby Bottles" to our parish brothers and sisters to fill with their offering and return them with in a three week period. During this Respect Life month—let us remember all of our decisions that involve life, from advocating for the unborn, for those suffering, close to the end, and all of the stages in between. Pray that we have the strength to support and lift one another closer to Jesus. Let us focus on what is important—God’s mission for ALL life in this world and set aside petty differences for the betterment of all!

ABOUT THE GOSPEL:

Jesus meets ten lepers who beg to be healed. After being cured, only one man, a Samaritan, returns to thank Jesus for healing him. Jesus tells this man that his faith has saved him.

IN CHURCH:

Before Mass begins, look around you for people who appear to be guests in your church. Greet them warmly or offer a Sign of Peace during Mass. Consider inviting this person to sit with your family if he or she is sitting alone.

QUESTIONS FOR THE WEEK:

- ◆ What is something that you took for granted this week?
- ◆ Are you part of any groups in school? What group(s) were the people that Jesus helped, a part of?
- ◆ Have you ever felt like an outsider? Do you know some people who are treated like outsiders? How can you make them feel welcomed?
- ◆ What did the 10 lepers, in the Gospel this week, ask Jesus to do for them? Did He do it? How?

FAMILY PRAYER:

Lord, we thank you for all of the ways that you have healed and helped us. We will try harder to not take you for granted. Amen.

QUESTIONS TO ASK YOURSELF NEXT WEEK, IN PREPARATION FOR MASS:

- ◆ Does anyone help you during the week? Who is it and how do they help you?
- ◆ Do you ever ask God for things, in prayer? Do you offer praise to Him as well?
- ◆ Do you help others that ask for help? Is it easy, or tough sometimes?

Who are you in the story told in the Gospel readings, this week? One of the 9 lepers who continued on? The single “former” leper who returned to thank Jesus for healing? Dare I ask if anyone places themselves in the place of Jesus? How about (my assumption is based on the placement of this account, in the Gospel of Luke, between stories of disciples and Apostles) one of Jesus’ disciples who were traveling with Him, but steering clear of the “unclean” people that Jesus was interacting with?

Many assumptions can be made. People, much smarter than I, debate the meaning of this miracle, it’s placement in Luke’s Gospel narrative, the original meaning of the words in their “original” (to the best of our human research) written language, inferred meanings vs implied teachings, etc. The simplest thing to remember is that God’s Word (in the written form) is still living and breathing, meant to reach out and touch each of those that dare to read and attempt to make sense, of each of the books in the vast library that we call—The Bible.

I see myself in many of the roles in this Gospel story, but I do not feel that I am one character all the time. I am extremely thankful and vocal about it (sometimes). I am thankful and don’t know how to express it to the person/people that I am thankful towards (many times). I find myself (like the inferred disciples) standing farther off, a little leery that my teacher is being engaged by a group of outcast individuals, and He is engaging them. I mean, come on, everything that we have been told tells us that we will be “unclean” and not welcomed in our place of worship if we interact with these individuals, BUT... my teacher, the one whom I call Rabbi, is speaking with them and sending them to the local priest. Whew, crisis averted, but wait, what was that shout? Oh no, here comes one of them back, and oh no, he fell down at Jesus’ feet. And wait, oh even worse. Not only was he an outcast, he is a Samaritan outcast! Thrown out of “that” group of miscreants.

Sorry, I got into that last one a little. I do think that very rarely do we meet someone who puts aside themselves to the extreme extent, for the good of the other. Often times, those that do this, are themselves outcast from their society, but Jesus asks us to give boldly for the good of others. Where are you in this story? I like to think that I’m like Jesus, but then, through a little introspection, I see that I am still a LOOOOONG way off! So, let me thank YOU! Each one of you who present a good example. Each of you who teach me new things, and each one of you who help me realize my insignificancies in a gentle, kind way.

To the youth of the parish—those, say 19 years old and younger, ask questions of us “old” people and weigh our mistakes, instead of making them yourselves. Join a group here at the parish and advocate for others around you, especially those in your age bracket! Help us continue the mission of Christ in the world, and get us to help you and support you! Be Jesus to those who haven’t heard or really thought of His message. Teach us how to reach out! Be like that 1 (former) leper—aware of what has just happened and be grateful to God even when those around you fail to notice!
