Fr. T's Tidbits: Marriage is in the air

This time of year seems to bring about engagements and planning for upcoming marriages. Primarily this article is for the newly engaged couple who are planning to be married at St. Jane Frances de Chantal. When contacting the parish, please ask to speak to Fr. Tony. The parish secretaries do not give out dates for weddings, that is done with the couple and me. If you have a question pertaining to marriage, please ask me.

One of the first questions I ask is if either of the couple has been married before. This is an important question because if either the man or woman has been married before, either in church or civilly, that marriage must be annulled first before they can enter into a new marriage. If there is a prior marriage, a date **cannot** be set until the prior marriage is annulled. The annulment process can take at least two years from start to completion.

The reason the Church asks for a recent baptismal certificate is twofold, firstly the baptismal certificate verifies that you have been baptized in the Catholic faith. Secondly, all your sacraments are recorded at the church of baptism and are noted on the back of the certificate. The notations on the back will record the sacraments that the person has already received namely Confirmation, Marriage, and Sacred Orders.

I prefer to meet those couples who are planning to get married as soon as possible so that they know what is expected of them in the course of marriage preparation. I have found that the sooner the preparation begins the easier the whole process of marriage becomes. I look forward to working with those who are planning their marriage.

The matrimonial covenant, by which a man and a woman establish between themselves a partnership of the whole of life, is by its nature ordered toward the good of the spouses and the procreation and education of offspring: this covenant between baptized persons has been raised by Christ the Lord to the dignity of a sacrament (canon 1055).

I would like to thank those couples from St. Jane Frances de Chantal who are involved in the Covenant Couples ministry. These couples are assigned a wedding couple and assist and walk with the couples as they prepare for their marriage and wedding day. You make my ministry a lot easier.

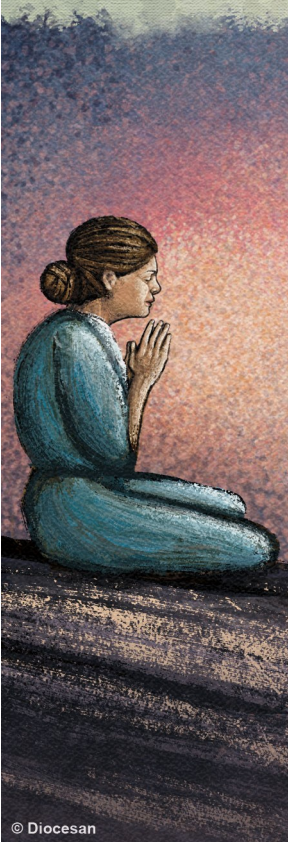

Here at St. Jane Frances we have a wonderful ministry of Hospitality – our Ushers group. Everyone who enters the Worship Space at weekend Mass encounters an Usher – each person is greeted as they enter into the Worship Space with a smile and a hymnal. Ushers are also available to help if you need assistance in any way.

- ✝ **Maybe you are being dropped off and need assistance in getting to a seat?** Let us know when you walk in and an Usher will assist you.
- ✝ **Need help with a hearing device?** Let an Usher know when you enter the Worship Space and they will get one for you.
- ✝ **Want to take up the Offertory gifts?** Feel free to sign up ahead of time in our Offertory gift bearers book at the Welcome Desk or...Ask an Usher!
- ✝ **Arrived late and want assistance finding an available seat?** Ushers are particularly good at this.
- ✝ **Not feeling well during Mass?** Ushers can assist with a wheelchair to help exit the Worship Space or bring water or juice if your blood sugar is low. They can also contact 911 in the case of an emergency.
- ✝ **Unable to join the line for reception of Communion?** Let an Usher know when you arrive and they will direct a Eucharistic Minister to come to you at the appropriate time.

Our Ushers serve for the express purpose of assisting all in participating in the Mass. They are the embodiment of Jesus' words, "I was a stranger and you welcomed me." QUESTIONS TO ASK YOURSELF NEXT WEEK.

IN PREPARATION FOR MASS:

- ◆ Do you count the good things that you have done and tell anyone that will listen, all about them?
- ◆ Are you humble? Do you pray for God to help you be a better person?
- ◆ Why did the “common” people look down on tax collectors?

Rules, rules, rules... It seems like there are rules for everything out there. Has anyone else wondered why there were rules for, seemingly, everything? I have thought long about it and the conclusion that I have arrived at is a simple one. It seems that all of the “I’s” in the world care more for the “me’s and mine” than for the others surrounding them.

So long as “I” am okay, then it’s OK. If we only had a few (say 10%) of the population do or think this way, then I really believe that we could “manage”, but in the way of the world today, it seems as if others do not have a clue of their impact on others. Just look at legal documents that you have to sign to buy a car (not to mention a house)! People no longer take care of other people; it seems as if we as a society spend more time covering our own best interests, and less time simply being nice and smiling at our neighbors around us.

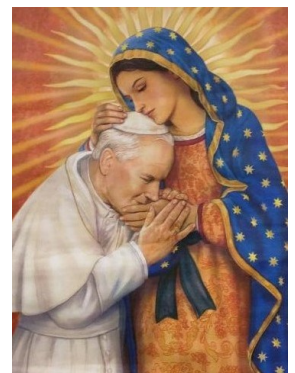
There was a book by Karol Wojtyla (Pope John Paul II - who has now been raised to canonized Sainthood) called Love & Responsibility that was first published in English back in 1981. I’ll be darned if I can find my copy of it to properly quote it, but it can be/is a pretty thick philosophical text, so I will share a “simple” lesson that I learned from my reading of it. We should never treat someone else as a means to an end, rather they should be treated as an end in themselves.

This is a very simple lesson, but definitely not an “easy” one. If we spent half the time that we spend, trying to find a way “around” or finding a loophole in the rules to benefit “me”, treating one another respectfully, and thinking about what someone else has done to be able to offer us something as simple as their time, we would be living in a much better world. We wouldn’t be so quick to sign up for something and then abandon that for something else that came up, or conversely, wait until the last minute to sign up for something and expect others to “make it work” for the almighty “me”.

We each have a role to fill not just for Me, Myself and I, but in and for the world around us. When we live the beatitudes and the 10 commandments—we shine as an example for others, even in our imperfect state of humanity, because the world wants what the world wants, and to be Catholic is truly a counter-cultural task!

Be firm and persistent in your life as you encounter others living for themselves, be an example TO them by putting yourself out there FOR them, happily. Will everyone see and know that you are doing this? No, most likely not. But know that in doing so, young people ARE watching and looking for the example that YOU show by being there for others and desire what is best for them, not just “Me, Myself and I”. I’ll see you on the journey.

People often ask how I became involved with numerous organizations and participate in so many diverse activities. The answer is that I follow a sort of mantra: **Accept every invitation.** Quite often that invitation comes in the form of hard work or time consuming activities, but in the end, the outcomes are all good and it makes for a very interesting and fulfilling life. On any given day I could be anywhere. Take for example last week; crew members from the USS Detroit (LCS 7) were in town to attend the Motor City Navy Birthday Ball I chaired at the Detroit Yacht Club on Friday, October 11th...here was my day:

- ✚ Took the crew to meet Police Chief James Craig and receive a Proclamation from Mayor Duggan....and met a number of police department officials.
- ✚ Visited Quicken Loans HQ (and if you have never done this, I suggest you do).
- ✚ Lunched at Mootz, a pizza place in an alleyway across from Quicken, where I met the owner, who was originally from New York...very interesting gentleman (great pizza!).
- ✚ Visited the Real Time Crime Center (green light crime prevention program) at Police HQ, so if you watch Live PD, you get the idea. Then we toured the police and fire museum there.
- ✚ Visited schools to interact with the kids and school officials.
- ✚ Hosted the Navy Ball, where I was able to meet/introduce several dignitaries including U.S. Sen. Gary Peters, Mrs. Barbara Levin (ship's sponsor and wife of Sen. Carl Levin), Admiral Greg Fenton, who commanded the carrier USS George Washington and was in charge of Fleet Forces in Japan, Sen. Michael MacDonald (MI Senator for St. Jane's district), and many other business people and organizational leaders...and 25 young people ages 10-18 from the U.S. Naval Sea Cadets.

The point is, all this started from one word I said many years ago: Yes. And now, I am asking you to do that too. We need leaders to support Children's Liturgy of the Word at 11:30 Mass. It is a very small time commitment: about 10-12 minutes on Sunday, with some prep work. I have asked my choir to take on this project and received positive responses, but we need a few more people so that you'd only have to do this less than once per month. Kids need to learn about Jesus through the readings and gospels on their own level. If that doesn't happen, they have no solid base to continue their faith as they grow older.
