FR. T'S TIDBITS: Catechetical Sunday

With school well underway, we also begin Faith Formation at St. Jane Frances de Chantal. I would like to thank Mr. Ben Klassen who is our director of Faith Formation and the catechists who will teach the children of St. Jane Frances this coming year.

The catechists are a great group of people who meet every week with the children and impart the faith of the Catholic Church and share their own stories and journey of faith. However, the catechists rely on the parents of our children to share their faith and journey of faith with their children. The Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us that parents are the first teachers of the faith. Children learn by what their parent's model for them.

As I mentioned in my homily two weeks ago we learn by the examples people set for us. May we model our faith for our children and for all those we come in contact with. In his book titled <u>Spiritual Writings</u>, Leo Tolstoy said "A Christian knows the truth only in the sense that he shows it to others." The Catechism also reminds us that the faith community as a whole must also model and give good example by word and deed what it means to be a follower and disciple of the Lord.

The theme of this year's Catechetical Sunday is **Encountering the Risen Christ**. This theme reminds us that we are all called to give witness to our faith in Jesus Christ. We begin this Faith Formation year invoking God to bless the children and their families, our catechists and faith community with a spirit of wonderment and awe about their faith. May we be open to the prompting of the Holy Spirit in our lives and the lives of the community of St. Jane Frances de Chantal.

- And more!


This series will be an excellent introduction with no prior knowledge or experience necessary.

LEARN THE GOSPEL, SHARE THE GOSPEL

This week's readings, in my mind speak greatly of the gift of Wisdom. How does wisdom differ from knowledge, understanding, and right judgement (counsel)? These are all Gifts that God bestows on each of us through not just our life, but in a special way, comes to us in the sacraments, particularly the Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. Two of these we enter into once, Baptism and Confirmation, but the Eucharist we can enter into daily if we choose to do so. This meal of Thanksgiving (eucharistia), is a recognizing of God's Gifts to us, and a strengthening for us as we leave the sanctuary of church and enter once again into the temptations of the world, where doubt, despair, sin and temptation runs to the extreme.

We know about things, we can understand things, but can we properly put knowledge and understanding into practice in our lives? To me, this is where Wisdom resides. Experiences, tied together with "head smarts", combined together in that gift of Wisdom. Personally, I have much more to experience and learn about, I am getting wiser, but I am far from being wise, for this wisdom, I look to those around me, who have worn the hip-waders (because they are wise enough to know they need them!) of life experience. Those who have done the work, lived a particular job, have suffered consequences from decisions and who have learned and adapted to live as God's servants in the secular world.

Did you know that today is Grandparent's Day? What better way to celebrate wisdom, than to visit and celebrate our grandparents who lived in a time very different than our own! Cellular phones—Psht! More than a single television in the house? Puh-lease! My Grandparents made their way through the world in ways, which to me seem almost unfathomable! Here was wisdom! Tying hard work, together with their negotiation of the world to provide for their families.

Go visit members of your family today, forget the sports, the TV, the computers, tablets and phones! Go and speak with people who have this wisdom. Learn from them! Hear stories of the past. I think you'll be surprised how, even though the world is so different today, the problems and issues that we face are remarkably the same! Packaged a little different, but very similar to the past!
